WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 26, 1939 decreased 3,847,733 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 87,402,917 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 119,754,329 bushels compared with 123,602,062 bushels for the previous week and 32,351,412 bushels for the week ending May 27, 1938. The stocks of 119,754,329 bushels include 9,771,645 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 26, 1939 were 117,246,329 bushels compared with 121,617,062 bushels for the previous week and 31,690,412 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,795,000; Interior Terminals 15,394,153; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,654,534; Victoria 632,946; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 39,196,699; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 15,095,574 and 7,318,041 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 3,080,000; Interior Elevators 152,254; Vancouver-New Westminster 186,279 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 374,185 bushels, while increases were noted at Victoria of 23,805; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,119,947 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 527,043 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 7,553,671 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,392,331 bushels for the week ending May 26, 1939 compared with 1,956,357 and 1,587,350 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,508,000 bushels, an increase of 523,000 bushels over the previous week when 1,985,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 441,000; Erie 470,000; Erie Canal 650,000; New York 104,000 and Albany 843,000 bushels. Increases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Erie 360,000; Erie Canal 125,000 and Albany 348,000 bushels, while decreases were noted at Buffalo of 19,000; Buffalo Afloat 246,000 and New York 45,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 661,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 186,000; Erie 358,000 and New York 117,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 26, 1939 amounted to 1,023,517 bushels, a decrease of 264,580 bushels from the previous week when 1,288,097 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 754,758 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 26, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 169,199 (179,583); Saskatchewan 499,100 (190,416); Alberta 355,218 (384,759) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-three weeks from August 1, 1938 to May 26, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 42,703,891 (36,849,518); Saskatchewan 110,875,596 (25,363,187): Alberta 122,907,461 (56,152,186) bushels. For the forty-three weeks ending May 26, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 276,486,948 and 118,364,891 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

CVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 26, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,590,137 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 198,000 bushels. The total is 3,788,137 bushels compared with 3,648,916 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 139,221 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 895,396 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending May 27, 1939 amounted to 17,669,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 15,334,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,128,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase of 1,292,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina and Australia were also higher by 748,000 and 1,247,000 bushels respectively.

During the first forty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 486,803,000 bushels as compared with only 425,952,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 205,356,000 bushels as compared with 157,144,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were over 25.9 million bushels higher for the first forty-three weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year, while Australian shipments were lower by 25.0 million bushels.




