WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 16, 1939 decreased 2,902,428 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 82,500,082 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 110,214,354 bushels compared with 113,116,782 bushels for the previous week and 27,714,272 hushels for the week ending June 17, 1938. The stocks of 110,214,354 bushels include 9,356,819 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending June 16, 1939 were 106,366,354 bushels compared with 109,416,782 bushels for the previous week and 26,737,272 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 13,245,000; Interior Terminals 14,373,027; Vancouver-New Westminster 8,526,964; Victoria 408,446; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 33,552,297; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 17,822,838 and 8,318,202 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 515,000; Interior Elevators 545,343; Vancouver-New Westminster 319,324; and Fort William and Port Arthur 2,727,686 bushels, while increases were noted at Victoria of 6,879 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 2,388,143 and 238,932 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,096,146 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,810,054 bushels for the week ending June 16, 1939 compared with 967,147 and 1,747,423 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,848,000 bushels, an increase of 148,000 bushels over the previous week when 3,700,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 177,000; Erie 400,000; Erie Canal 320,000; New York 47,000 and Albany 2,683,000 bushels. Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 122,000; Erie 3,000; Erie Canal 605,000 and New York 17,000 bushels while Buffalo Afloat and Albany increased 221,000 and 674,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 977,000 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 139,000; Erie 408,000; New York 159,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 16, 1939 amounted to 967,997 bushels, a decrease of 490,714 bushels from the previous week when 1,458,711 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 806,445 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 16, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 169,407 (111,435); Saskatchewan 384,421 (314,750); Alberta 414,169 (380,260) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-six weeks from August 1, 1938 to June 16, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 43,241,518 (37,382,768); Saskatchewan 112,611,976 (26,074,557); Alberta 124,414,466 (57,300,807 bushels. For the forty-six weeks ending June 16, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 280,267,960 and 120,758,132 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 16, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,096,895 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 259,000 bushels. The total is 3,355,895 bushels compared with 2,586,484 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 769,411 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,470,675 bushels.
