WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 23, 1939 decreased 3,744,220 bushels, as compared with the previous week and increased 79,925,829 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 106,470,134 bushels compared with 110,214,354 bushels for the previous week and 26,544,305 bushels for the week ending June 24, 1938. The stocks of 106,470,134 bushels include 9,704,697 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending June 23, 1939 were 102,005,134 bushels compared with 106,366,354 bushels for the previous week and 25,704,305 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 12,910,000; Interior Terminals 14,035,134; Vancouver-New Westminster 8,188,252; Victoria 408,279; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 29,806,628; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 17,949,391 and 9,101,115 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 335,000; Interior Elevators 337,893; Vancouver-New Westminster 338,712; Victoria 167; and Fort William and Port Arthur 3,745,669 bushels, while increases were noted at Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 126,553 and 782,913 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,588,068 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,804,887 bushels for the week ending June 23, 1939 compared with 1,267,963 and 504,248 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,465,000 bushels, an increase of 617,000 bushels over the previous week when 3,848,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 596,000; Buffalo Afloat 52,000; Erie 398,000; Erie Canal 300,000; New York 44,000; New York Afloat 22,000 and Albany 3,053,000 bushels. Decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 169,000; Erie 2,000; Erie Canal 20,000 and New York 3,000 bushels while increases were indicated at Buffalo of 419,000; New York Afloat 22,000 and Albany 370,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 840,000 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 139,000; Buffalo Afloat 40,000; Erie 258,000; Erie Canal 50,000; New York 82,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 23, 1939 amounted to 968,317 bushels, a decrease of 118,656 bushels from the previous week when 1,086,973 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,017,121 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 23, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 127,718 (189,086); Saskatchewan 457,799 (396,931); Alberta 382,800 (431,104) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-seven weeks from August 1, 1938 to June 23, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 43,415,614 (37,571,854); Saskatchewan 113,125,396 (26,471,488); Alberta 124,814,243 (57,731,911) bushels. For the forty-seven weeks ending June 23, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 281,355,253 and 121,775,253 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 23, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,090,519 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 281,000 bushels. The total is 2,371,519 bushels compared with 3,355,895 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 984,376 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,472,051 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 17, 1939 amounted to 13,548,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 17,227,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,992,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases of 814,000 and 2,420,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while shipments from Australia were higher.

During the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 546,271,000 bushels as compared with only 461,632,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 225,902,000 bushels as compared with 172,072,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were over 42 million bushels higher for the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year, while Australian shipments were lower by 26.6 million bushels.
