### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 30, 1939 decreased 2,389,035 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 78,174,993 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 104,081,099 bushels compared with 106,470,134 bushels for the previous week and 25,906,106 bushels for the week ending July 1, 1938. The stocks of 104,081,099 bushels include 9,404,445 bushels of Durum wheat.

### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the weak ending June 30, 1939 were 98,123,099 bushels compared with 102,005,134 bushels for the previous week and 24,065,106 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 12,375,000; Interior Terminals 13,795,550; Vancouver-New Westminster 8,098,027; Victoria 270,932; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 26,014,689; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 19,560,611 and 9,365,639 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 535,000; Interior Elevators 239,584; Vancouver-New Westminster 90,225; Victoria 134,347; and Fort William and Port Arthur 3,791,939 bushels, while increases were noted at Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,611,220 and 264,524 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,832,716 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,596,555 bushels for the week ending June 30, 1939 compared with 1,368,919 and 700,183 bushels for the same period last year.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,958,000 bushels, an increase of 1,493,000 bushels over the previous week when 4,465,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,215,000; Buffalo Afloat 248,000; Erie 394,000; Erie Canal 638,000; New York 88,000; and Albany 3,375,000. Increases were noted at Buffalo of 619,000; Buffalo Afloat 196,000; Erie Canal 338,000; New York 44,000 and Albany 322,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Erie and New York Afloat of 4,000 and 22,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 841,000 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 230,000; Erie 258,000; Erie Canal 20,000; New York 62,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 30, 1939 amounted to 1,057,036 bushels, a decrease of 42,536 bushels from the previous week when 1,099,572 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 697,371 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 30, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 136,785 (159,815); Saskatchewan 387,521 (260,747); Alberta 532,730 (276,809) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-eight weeks from August 1, 1938 to June 30, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 43,568,479 (37,731,669); Saskatchewan 113,598,855 (26,732,235); Alberta 125,376,210 (58,008,720) bushels. For the forty-eight weeks ending June 30, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 282,543,544 and 122,472,624 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 30, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,729,426 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 197,000 bushels. The total is 2,926,426 bushels compared with 2,371,519 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 554,907 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,875,115 bushels.
