WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 2, 1938 increased 28,422,476 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 16,326,788 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 66,090,748 bushels compared with 37,668,272 bushels for the previous week and 49,763,960 bushels for the week ending September 3, 1937. The stocks of 66,090,748 bushels include 13,430,159 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 634,000 bushels, a decrease of 645,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,279,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 217,000; Erie 35,000; New York, 123,000; New York Afloat 193,000 and Albany 66,000 bushels. Decreases in the stocks from those of a week ago were noted on the Erie Canal of 362,000; New York 57,000 and New York Afloat 379,000 bushels while increases were shown at Buffalo of 96,000 and Albany 57,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,547,314 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth, 71,314; Buffalo 381,000; New York 1,423,000; New York Afloat 57,000 and Albany 615,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada totalled 107,319 bushels compared with 1,449,071 bushels for the previous year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending September 2, 1938 were 654,56,748 bushels compared with 36,389,272 bushels for the previous week and 47,216,646 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 24,785,000; Interior Terminals 1,666,741; Vancouver-New Westminster 106,653; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 8,818,674; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 2,053,372 and 2,198,287 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 12,681,000; Interior Terminal Elevators 352,229; Vancouver-New Westminster 39,298; Fort William and Port Arthur 445,140 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 54,790 bushels. An increase is reported at the Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports of 467,090 bushels.

Wheat in transit by rail amounted to 15,733,378 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 2,617,870 bushels for the week ending September 2, 1938 compared with 8,304,735 and 1,038,315 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 2, 1938 amounted to 24,853,649 bushels, an increase of 10,147,462 bushels over the previous week when 14,706,187 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 11,788,675 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 2, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 10,358,006 (6,735,630); Saskatchewan 9,698,026 (2,682,780); Alberta 4,797,617 (2,370,265) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the five weeks from August 1, 1938 to September 2, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 23,059,678 (15,017,345); Saskatchewan 15,651,763 (6,251,830); Alberta 7,668,778 (4,443,673) bushels. For the five weeks ending September 2, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 46,380,219 and 25,712,848 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending September 2, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,923,209 bushels and no imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were reported. This compares with 1,624,955 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 298,254 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 612,769 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending September 3, 1938 amounted to 10,624,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,414,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,704,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase of 350,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine and Australian shipments showed decreases of 131,000 and 401,000 bushels respectively.

During the first five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 58,198,000 bushels as compared with only 35,792,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 20,616,000 bushels as compared with 14,152,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. For the first five weeks of the present crop year Russia shipped 14,840,000 bushels as compared with 1,496,000 bushels for the same weeks last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour in the first five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1937:-

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 11.7 million bushels compared with 7.1 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1937. North American weekly average shipments amounted to 4.1 million bushels as compared with 2.8 million bushels in the same weeks last year.




