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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 21, 1939 increased 387,545 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 72,864,602 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 99,638,156 bushels compared with 99,250,611 bushels for the previous week and 21,773,554 bushels for the week of July 22, 1938. The stocks of 99,638,156 bushels include 9,554,524 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending July 21, 1939 were 92,430,156 bushels compared with 92,048,611 bushels for the previous week and 20,974,554 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 10,490,000; Interior Terminals 9,751,028; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,177,269; Victoria 287,160; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 15,227,427; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 26,429,402 and 9,075,069 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 1,870,000; Interior Elevators 1,585,026; Vancouver-New Westminster 120,742; and Fort William and Port Arthur 852,809 bushels, while increases were noted at Victoria of 14,944 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 2,312,823 and 418,310 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,495,009 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 7,284,412 bushels for the week ending July 21, 1939 compared with 2,424,523 and 1,623,563 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 7,208,000 bushels, an increase of 6,000 bushels over the previous week when 7,202,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,387,000; Buffalo Afloat 261,000; Erie 720,000; Erie Canal 535,000; New York 267,000; New York Afloat 40,000 and Albany 3,998,000 bushels. Increases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 2,000; Erie Canal 295,000; New York 12,000 and Albany 106,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 318,000; Erie 1,000 and New York Afloat 90,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 799,000 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 261,000; Erie 170,000; Erie Canal 203,000; New York 120,000 and Albany 45,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 21, 1939 amounted to 1,930,224 bushels, a decrease of 558,830 bushels from the previous week when 2,489,054 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 645,828 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 21, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 119,518 (116,246); Saskatchewan 996,983 (274,389); Alberta 813,723 (255,193) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-one weeks from August 1, 1938 to July 21, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 44,095,368 (38,128,896); Saskatchewan 117,156,076 (27,613,638); Alberta 127,860,771 (59,078,302) bushels. For the fifty-one weeks ending July 21, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 289,112,215 and 124,820,836 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 21, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,719,930 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 217,000 bushels. The total is 1,936,930 bushels compared with 2,997,908 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,060,978 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 869,681 bushels.
