GRAIN STOCKS IN ELEVATORS.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending January 14th, 1921 the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 1,578,351 bushels in wheat, flax and rye as compared with the previous week. Decreases are shown of 1,492,613; 39,619 and 46,119 bushels respectively in the foregoing grains. Oats indicates an increase of 584,444 bushels and barley, 60,114 bushels. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 1,096,218 bushels; and flax, 102,194 bushels. Oats shows an increase of 326,058 bushels and barley, 22,343 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 96,224 bushels and barley, 5,464 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 101,084 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur the quantity of grain in store has increased by 807,229 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 276,867 bushels; oats, 401,001 bushels; barley, 68,918 bushels and flax, 60,443 bushels. Eye indicates a decrease of 16,114 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 173,519 bushels. Oats shows an increase of 47,653 bushels; barley, 11,418 bushels; Flax, 9,275 bushels and rye, 909 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East the quantity of grain in store has decreased by 335,596 bushels in oats, barley and flax. Decreases are shown of 291,352; 37,101 and 7,143 bushels respectively. Wheat shows an increase of 2,851 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports decreases are shown in wheat of 406,370 bushels and rye, 30,914 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending January 14th, 1921, show 4,088 cars as compared with 3,790 of the previous week.
