Grain Stocks in Elevators.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending February 25th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has increased by 1,196,858 bushels in oats, barley, flax and rye, as compared with the previous week. Increases are shown of 950,268; 149,413; 76,272 and 20,905 bushels respectively in the foregoing grains. Wheat indicates a decrease of 432,381 bushels. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 519,612 bushels and barley, 672 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 273,955 bushels and flax, 3,198 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 48,787 bushels; oats, 115,006 bushels; barley, 1,118 bushels and flax, 206 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Port William and Port Arthur an increase is shown in wheat of 254,202 bushels; oats, 545,637 bushels; barley, 95,221 bushels; flax, 74,559 bushels and rye, 23,322 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 160,286 bushels; oats, 85,465 bushels; barley, 16,440 bushels and rye, 1,535 bushels. Flax indicates a decrease of 1,891 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East the quantity of grain in store has decreased by 173,472 bushels in wheat and oats, 67,775 bushels. Barley indicates an increase of 37,156 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports a decrease is shown in wheat of 203,022 bushels and rye, 4,052 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending February 21st, 1921 show 2,261 cars as compared with 3,820 of the previous week.
