GRAIN STOCKS IN ELEVATORS.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending February 4th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 1,756,754 bushels in wheat and flax, as compared with the previous week. Wheat indicates a decrease of 1,680,753 bushels and flax, 76,001 bushels. Oats shows an increase of 1,480,777 bushels; barley, 64,523 bushels and rye, 7,777 bushels. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 1,327,069 bushels and flax, 167,140 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 196,236 bushels and barley, 142,907 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 268,415 bushels; oats, 239,942 bushels; barley, 1,707 bushels and rye, 1,709 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur an increase is shown in oats of 455,113 bushels; barley 972 bushels; flax 76,343 bushels and rye, 586 bushels. Wheat indicates a decrease of 456,916 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 71,672 bushels; oats, 138,661 bushels; barley, 37,048 bushels and flax, 14,796 bushels. Rye shows a decrease of 1,545 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East the quantity of grain in store has increased by 450,825 bushels in oats. Wheat shows a decrease of 317,733 bushels and barley, 118,161 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports an increase is shown in wheat of 60,878 bushels and rye, 7,027 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending January 31st, 1921, show 5,664 cars as compared with 3,529 of the previous week.
