DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS.

INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending March 4th, 1921, the quantity of grains in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has increased by 1,440,503 bushels in all grains as compared with the previous week. Increases are shown in wheat of 125,299 bushels; Oats, 1,073,341 bushels; Barley, 188,887 bushels; Flax, 44,489 bushels and Rye, 8,487 bushels. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 490,508 bushels; barley, 9,541 bushels and flax, 21,148 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 137,914 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 195,475 bushels; oats, 490,427 bushels; barley, 5,296 and flax 1,430 bushels, rye, 2,221 bushels.

In the public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur an increase is shown in wheat of 317,934 bushels, oats, 464,645 bushels, barley, 120,080 bushels, flax, 64,207 bushels and rye, 25,045 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 105,265 bushels; barley, 549 bushels and rye, 437 bushels. Oats indicates a decrease of 13,155 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East the quantity of grain in store has increased by 72,503 bushels in barley, while wheat indicates a decrease of 2,870 bushels and oats, 6,490 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports a decrease is shown in rye of 19,214 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending February 28th, 1921 show 3,309 cars as compared with 2,261 of the previous week.

Additional information is furnished in the following tables for the year ending March 31, 1932, and for the period from 1927 to 1931. The figures are based on the data furnished by the various countries and are subject to the usual inaccuracies of such statistics. The figures are expressed in thousands of dollars unless otherwise indicated.

In the United States, the value of exports to Canada for the year ending March 31, 1932, was \$1,000,000,000, compared with \$900,000,000 in 1931 and \$800,000,000 in 1930. The value of imports from Canada for the same period was \$500,000,000, compared with \$450,000,000 in 1931 and \$400,000,000 in 1930.

In the United Kingdom, the value of exports to Canada for the year ending March 31, 1932, was \$200,000,000, compared with \$180,000,000 in 1931 and \$160,000,000 in 1930. The value of imports from Canada for the same period was \$100,000,000, compared with \$90,000,000 in 1931 and \$80,000,000 in 1930.

In the Empire, the value of exports to Canada for the year ending March 31, 1932, was \$300,000,000, compared with \$280,000,000 in 1931 and \$260,000,000 in 1930. The value of imports from Canada for the same period was \$150,000,000, compared with \$140,000,000 in 1931 and \$130,000,000 in 1930.

In the other countries, the value of exports to Canada for the year ending March 31, 1932, was \$400,000,000, compared with \$380,000,000 in 1931 and \$360,000,000 in 1930. The value of imports from Canada for the same period was \$200,000,000, compared with \$190,000,000 in 1931 and \$180,000,000 in 1930.
