According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending April 22nd, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada, has decreased by 4,249,899 bushels in wheat; oats, 1,908,018 bushels; barley, 834,386 bushels; flax, 162,901 bushels and rye, 199,703 bushels as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 201,301 bushels; oats, 984,500 bushels; barley, 289,470 bushels and flax, 54,267 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 561,106 bushels; oats, 177,246 bushels; barley, 8,131 bushels and rye, 944 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur decreases are shown in wheat of 2,243,653 bushels; oats, 445,007 bushels; barley, 366,448 bushels; flax, 89,200 bushels and rye, 24,727 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators wheat shows a decrease of 525,299 bushels; oats, 88,301 bushels; barley, 7,256 bushels and flax, 18,605 bushels. Rye indicates an increase of 532 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East the quantity of grain in store has decreased by 316,530 bushels in oats and barley, 25,296 bushels. Wheat indicates an increase of 259,223 bushels.

In the U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports a decrease is shown in wheat of 415,567 bushels; barley, 139,012 bushels and rye, 174,564 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 22,350 bushels.

In the U. S. Lake Ports a decrease is shown in wheat of 562,196 bushels and flax, 830 bushels while oats indicates an increase of 81,216 bushels and barley, 1,227 bushels.

The movement of grain by water for the week ending April 21st, 1921, is as follows:- Wheat 5,653,257 bushels; oats, 1,994,543 bushels; barley, 580,295 bushels; flax, 254,235 bushels and rye, 43,781 bushels. The Lower lake ports received 1,881,388 bushels of wheat, 1,076,559 bushels of oats, 343,227 bushels of barley, and 43,781 bushels of rye.

The inspections for the week ending April 21st, 1921 show 2,223 cars as compared with 2,145 of the previous week.
