INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending April 8th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 1,161,546 bushels in wheat; oats, 40,102 bushels and barley, 409,609 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 121,787 bushels and rye, 44,491 bushels, as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 607,709 bushels; oats, 470,355 bushels and barley, 703,580 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 76,364 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 300,897 bushels and rye, 42 bushels; while oats indicates an increase of 162,896 bushels; barley, 3,684 bushels and flax, 279 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur an increase is shown wheat of 186,531 bushels; oats, 786,715 bushels; barley, 181,664 bushels; flax, 38,781 bushels and rye, 16,226 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in wheat of 155,244 bushels; oats, 50,541 bushels; barley, 391 bushels and flax, 5,441 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East decreases are shown in wheat of 370,606 bushels and oats, 550,368 bushels; while barley indicates an increase of 22,682 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports wheat indicates a decrease of 759,369 bushels and oats, 72,692 bushels. Barley shows an increase of 84,323 bushels and rye, 28,307 bushels.

In the United States Lake Ports, Buffalo and Duluth the quantity of grain in store is as follows: Wheat, 535,260 bushels; Oats, 52,161 bushels; barley, 1,227 bushels and flax, 922 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending April 7th, 1921, show 2,482 cars as compared with 4,427 of the previous week.
