INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending May 13th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada, has decreased by 3,047,411 bushels in wheat; oats, 2,247,208 bushels; barley, 71,145 bushels; flax, 350,060 bushels and rye, 46,334 bushels. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 1,771,480 bushels; oats, 1,509,215 bushels; barley, 179,676 bushels and Flax, 223,849 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 115,586 bushels; Oats, 513,114 bushels; barley, 3,174 bushels; Flax, 46 bushels and rye, 436 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur decreases are shown in wheat of 990,529 bushels; oats, 902,107 bushels; barley, 52,413 bushels; flax, 112,756 bushels and rye, 28,692 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 347,829 bushels and flax, 13,409 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 14,630 bushels; barley, 30,874 bushels and rye, 886 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East increases are shown in wheat of 340,394 bushels; oats, 320,582 bushels; barley, 282,037 bushels and rye, 15,886 bushels.

In the U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports a decrease is shown in wheat of 208,118 bushels; barley, 83,117 bushels and rye, 33,978 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 192,232 bushels.

In the U. S. Lake Ports wheat indicates an increase of 45,737 bushels and oats, 149,784 bushels. Barley shows a decrease of 65,676 bushels.

The movement of grain by water for the week ending May 7th, 1921, is as follows:- Wheat, 3,301,155 bushels; Oats, 2,281,637 bushels; Barley, 562,169 bushels; Flax, 189,159 bushels and rye, 20,531 bushels. The lower lake ports received 2,442,070 bushels of wheat; 1,797,815 bushels of oats; 448,510 bushels of barley; and 20,531 bushels of rye.

The inspections for the week ending May 14th, 1921, show 1,441 cars as compared with 1,770 of the previous week.
