INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending May 20th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 3,000,763 bushels in wheat; oats, 2,558,510 bushels; barley, 363,662 bushels; flax, 170,123 bushels and rye, 17,966 bushels, as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 960,048 bushels; oats, 1,548,946 bushels; barley, 231,103 bushels; and flax, 193,823 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 33,014 bushels; oats, 254,760 bushels and barley, 9,897 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur wheat shows a decrease of 986,595 bushels; oats, 1,048,911 bushels; barley, 167,822 bushels and flax, 32,765 bushels. Rye indicates an increase of 22,841 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in wheat of 128,430 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 88,791 bushels; barley, 5,220 bushels; flax, 11,215 bushels and rye, 3,248 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East wheat shows a decrease of 769,281 bushels; barley, 26,748 bushels and rye, 14,765 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 165,097 bushels and flax, 45,250 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports increases are shown in wheat of 220,545 bushels; oats, 190,003 bushels and barley, 66,888 bushels. Rye indicates a decrease of 29,290 bushels.

In the United States Lake Ports decreases are shown in wheat of 343,940 bushels; oats, 149,784 bushels and barley, 200 bushels.

The movement of grain by water for the week ending May 14th, 1921, is as follows:- Wheat, 2,190,519 bushels; oats, 2,495,510 bushels; barley, 170,076 bushels; flax, 185,959 bushels and rye, 24,000 bushels. The Canadian Lower Lake Ports received 1,658,588 bushels of wheat; & 1,761,152 bushels of oats.

The inspections for the week ending May 21st, 1921, show 1,307 cars as compared with 1,441 of the previous week.
