INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending June 10th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 2,321,430 bushels in wheat; oats, 2,184,414 bushels; barley, 303,270 bushels; flax, 41,569 bushels and rye, 44,515 bushels, as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators a decrease is shown in oats of 236,538 bushels and flax, 33,157 bushels. Wheat indicates an increase of 68,819 bushels and barley, 135,609 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 2,355 bushels; oats, 407,932 bushels; barley, 6,094 bushels and rye, 1,996 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 23 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur decreases are shown in wheat of 2,306,744 bushels; oats, 1,640,321 bushels; barley, 103,632 bushels; flax, 13,138 bushels and rye, 38,044 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in oats of 315,362 bushels and barley, 84,258 bushels. Wheat and flax indicate increases of 103,828 and 4,703 bushels respectively.

In the Public Elevators in the East wheat shows a decrease of 128,527 bushels; barley, 110,832 bushels and rye, 7,953 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 257,240 bushels.

In the U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports increases are shown in oats of 158,499 bushels and rye, 3,478 bushels. Wheat indicates a decrease of 15,429 bushels and barley, 134,063 bushels.

In the U. S. Lake Ports a decrease is shown in wheat of 41,022 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending June 7th, 1921, show 1,292 cars as compared with 1,609 of the previous week.
