AMERICAN COAL STATISTICS - YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1911

General Summary of Coal Production and Consumption in the United States, 1911. This report contains a detailed account of the coal industry in the United States for the year ending June 30, 1911. It includes data on production, consumption, and exports, as well as a discussion of the factors influencing the coal market.

INTERNAL TRADE DIVISION.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending June 3rd, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased by 947,419 bushels in wheat; oats, 2,445,829 bushels; barley, 457,449 bushels and rye, 245,795 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 22,734 bushels, as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 520,141 bushels; oats, 269,129 bushels; barley, 183,082 bushels and flax, 47,571 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 20,388 bushels; oats, 174,451 bushels; barley, 37 bushels and rye, 285 bushels.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur wheat indicates a decrease of 605,614 bushels; oats, 697,500 bushels; barley, 129,550 bushels and rye, 229,020 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 65,509 bushels. In the Private Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 277,070 bushels; oats, 58,335 bushels; barley, 11,456 bushels and rye, 1,392 bushels. Flax indicates an increase of 6,849 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East decreases are shown in oats of 888,685 bushels; barley, 166,020 bushels; flax, 2,053 bushels and rye, 17,540 bushels. Wheat indicates an increase of 449,161 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports A decrease is shown in oats of 251,628 bushels. Barley and rye indicate increases of 32,696 and 2,442 bushels respectively.

In the United States Lake Ports a decrease is shown in oats of 106,101 bushels; while wheat indicates an increase of 26,633 bushels.

The movement of grain by water for the week ending May 31st, 1921, is as follows:- Wheat 3,469,068 bushels; oats, 2,039,387 bushels; barley, 601,902 bushels and rye, 249,681 bushels. The Canadian Lower Lake Ports received 2,779,198 bushels of wheat; 1,813,446 bushels of oats; 459,682 bushels of barley and rye, 231,681 bushels.

The inspections for the week ending May 31st, 1921, show 1,609 cars as compared with 1,307 of the previous week.
