INTERNAL TRADE BRANCH.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 8th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different Public Elevators throughout Canada has decreased in Wheat by 561,145 bushels; barley 209,117 bushels; Oats, Flax and Rye show increases of 930,205, 21,613 and 50,274 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week. Briefly the situation of grain in store is as follows:-

In the Western Country Elevators decreases are shown in Oats of 252,882 bushels, Barley, 62,285 bushels, Flax, 32,665 bushels; wheat indicates an increase of 52,819 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators an increase is shown in Wheat of 93 bushels, while Oats, Barley and Flax show decreases of 6,568 bushels, 820 bushels and 925 bushels respectively.

In the Public Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur Wheat indicates a decrease of 148,569 bushels; Oats, 124,397 bushels; Barley, Flax and Rye show increases of 47,278, 52,655 and 23,944 bushels respectively. In the Private Terminal Elevators decreases are shown in Wheat of 128,300 bushels and Oats 22,034 bushels. Barley, Flax and Rye show increases of 25,360, 13,201 and 1,264 bush. respectively.

In the Public Elevators in the East increases are shown in Oats of 1,132,996 bushels; Rye 24,022 bushels, Wheat indicates a decrease of 250,047 bushels, barley 218,650 bushels and Flax 10,648 bushels.

In the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports increases are shown in Oats of 203,090 and Rye 1,044 bushels, Wheat indicates a decrease of 3,316 bushels.

In the U. S. Lake Ports an increase is shown in Wheat of 83,825 bushels.

The Inspections for the week ending July 7th, 1921 show 2,136 cars as compared with 3,050 cars of the previous week.
