CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 2nd, 1921.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending September 2nd, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different elevators throughout Canada has increased by 2,311,180 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat, 853,604 bushels; oats, 1,301,163 bushels; barley, 129,955 bushels and rye, 181,005 bushels. Flax indicates the only decrease of 154,547 bushels.

The Western Country Elevators show increases in wheat of 254,778 bushels; oats, 1,904,712 bushels; barley, 59,282 bushels and rye, 15,025 bushels. Flax shows a decrease of 48,973 bushels. Of the total quantity in store viz 5,765,747 bushels the following was held by the different Prairie Provinces.-

The receipts at Country Elevators were 887,781 bushels and shipments 570,295 bushels of wheat. The quantity loaded over the Loading Platforms for the week ending August 31st, 1921, was.- Wheat, 53,032 bushels and other grains 77,750 bushels.

In the Interior Terminal Elevators a decrease is shown in oats of 25,175 bushels, while wheat shows an increase of 1,158 bushels.

The Public Terminal Elevators at the Head of the Lakes show increases in wheat of 709,507 bushels; barley, 296 bushels and rye, 152,073 bushels. Oats and flax show decreases of 637,564 and 98,364 bushels respectively.

In the Private Terminal Elevators increases are shown in wheat of 221,362 bushels; flax, 2,943 bushels and rye, 5,449 bushels. Oats and barley indicate decreases of 195,109 and 1,956 bushels respectively.

The quantity in store at the Public Elevators in the East has increased in oats by 254,248 bushels and barley, 77,727 bushels. Wheat and flax show decreases of 274,970 and 9,828 bushels respectively. The receipts of wheat were 688,293 bushels by vessel and 720,136 bushels by rail, while shipments by vessel were 920,181 and 763,218 bushels by rail.

The quantity of U. S. Grain in Store at Public Elevators in the East was.- 11,565,000 bushels compared with 1,856,548 bushels last year. The bulk of the former was made up of wheat and corn viz 5,513,311 and 4,362,636 bushels respectively.

The U.S. Lake Ports show an increase in wheat of 6,653 bush. Barley and flax show decreases of 157 and 325 bushels respectively.

In the U.S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports decreases are shown in wheat of 64,884 bushels and barley, 5,237 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 51 bushels and rye, 8,458 bushels.

The movement of grain by water for period from August 15th, to 31st, 1921, was as follows.- Wheat 2,897,020 bushels; Oats, 3,613,688 bushels; Barley, 445,514 bushels and flax, 380,872 bushels. The total quantities shipped by water since opening of navigation to the end of the crop year August 31st, 1921, were as follows.-

The inspection returns for the week ending August 31st, 1921 show 4,370 cars against 1,277 last year; of the former 3,338 cars were for the new crop, 2,943 of the same being wheat of which 2,737 cars graded No. 3 Northern and better. The total number of cars inspected during the crop year ending August 31st, 1921, was, 204,923 as compared with 149,271 of the previous year.
