CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 4th, 1921.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending November 4th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different elevators throughout Canada has increased by 5,820,031 bushels made up as follows.- Wheat, 5,630,368 bushels; oats, 18,795 bushels; flax, 128,854 bushels and rye, 42,014 bushels. Barley shows a decrease of 654,050 bushels.

In the Western Country Elevators decreases are shown in wheat of 908,242 bushels; oats, 138,427 bushels and barley, 39,173 bushels. Flax and rye indicate increases of 63,275 and 10,386 bushels respectively. Of the total quantity in store viz 34,866,998 bushels the following were held by the different Prairie Provinces:-

The receipts of wheat at Country Elevators were 9,456,648 bushels and the shipments 10,486,685 bushels.

The Interior Terminal Elevators show increases in wheat of 28,157 bushels; barley, 1,752 bushels and rye, 729 bushels. Oats shows a decrease of 16,310 bushels.

In the Public and Private Terminal Elevators at Port William and Port Arthur increases are shown in wheat and oats of 1,243,245 and 690,214 bushels respectively. Barley shows a decrease of 232,982 bushels; flax, 11,369 bushels and rye, 11,579 bushels. The receipts of all grains were 15,840,030 bushels and the shipments by vessel 13,788,550 bushels and by rail 373,951 bushels.

The Private Terminal Elevators at Winnipeg show increases in wheat of 5,240 bushels and oats, 3,163 bushels. Barley indicates a decrease of 5,047 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East increases are shown in wheat of 1,447,755 bushels; and flax, 76,948 bushels. Oats and barley indicate decreases of 519,845 and 203,184 bushels respectively. The receipts of wheat were 3,914,189 bushels by vessel and 424,952 bushels by rail while the shipments were 1,530,445 bushels by vessel and 1,360,944 bushels by rail.

The quantity of U. S. Grain in Store at the Public Elevators in the East was 7,702,675 bushels compared with 1,639,995 last year. The bulk of the former was made up of wheat and corn viz 1,469,773 and 5,289,259 bushels respectively.

In the U. S. Lake Ports an increase is shown in wheat of 2,227,875 bushels and a decrease in barley of 170,444 bushels. Of the quantity of wheat in store viz 4,048,811 bushels, 1,106,818 bushels were afloat wheat.

The U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports show increases in wheat and rye of 1,586,338 and 42,478 bushels respectively. Barley indicates a decrease of 4,972 bushels.

According to returns received at the Department for the year ending December 31, 1911, the quantity of grain in stock at the beginning of the year was 1,450,000 bushels, valued at \$1,450,000.
