CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 25th, 1921.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending November 25th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different elevators throughout Canada has increased by 2,248,143 bushels made up as follows.- Wheat, 1,655,302 bushels; oats, 100,664 bushels; and barley, 492,177 bushels. Flax and rye indicate decreases of 14,558 and 102,866 bushels respectively.

In the Western Country Elevators increases are shown in wheat of 514,128 bushels; oats, 412,896 bushels and barley, 132,638 bushels. Flax shows a decrease of 3,784 bushels and rye, 7,648 bushels. Of the total quantity in store viz 36,813,743 bushels the following were held by the different Prairie Provinces:-

The receipts of wheat at Country Elevators were 7,924,427 bushels and the shipments 7,413,790 bushels. The Platform Loadings for the week ending November 14th, 1921, were as follows.- Wheat, 693,869 bushels and other grains 211,136 bushels.

The Interior Terminal Elevators show increases in wheat of 72,627 bushels; oats, 38,963 bushels; barley, 15,092 bushels and rye 1,191 bushels.

In the Public and Private Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur decreases are shown in wheat and oats of 3,107,516 and 450,882 bushels respectively, while increases are shown in barley of 119,234 bushels; flax, 659 bushels and rye, 19,026 bushels. The receipts of all grains were 10,621,078 bushels and the shipments by vessel 13,551,006 bushels and by rail 489,551 bushels.

The Private Terminal Elevators at Winnipeg show increases in wheat of 264,502 bushels and barley, 7,969 bushels. Oats and flax show decreases of 13,819 and 5 bushels respectively.

In the Public Elevators in the East decreases are shown in all grains and are as follows.- Wheat, 68,093 bushels; oats, 16,893 bushels; barley, 134,912 bushels; flax, 11,428 bushels and rye, 119,435 bushels. The receipts of wheat were 2,858,398 bushels by vessel and 800,714 bushels by rail while the shipments were 1,751,283 bushels by vessel and 2,002,921 bushels by rail.

The quantity of United States Grain in Store at the Public Elevators in the East was 4,365,117 bushels compared with 1,259,573 bushels last year. The bulk of the former was made up of wheat and corn viz, 998,125 and 2,715,990 bushels respectively.

In the U. S. Lake Ports increases are shown in wheat of 3,266,971 bushels; oats, 33,197 bushels and barley, 352,156 bushels

The U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports show increases in wheat of 712,683 bushels; oats, 97,202 bushels and rye, 4,000 bushels.
