CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 9th, 1921.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending December 9th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different elevators throughout Canada has increased by 3,519,498 bushels made up as follows.- Wheat 2,964,718 bushels; oats, 399,360 bushels; barley, 19,206 bushels and rye, 156,214 bushels. Flax indicates a decrease of 58,381 bushels.

In the Western Country Elevators increases are shown in wheat of 349,023 bushels; oats, 636,476 bushels and barley, 110,911 bushels. Flax and Rye show decreases of 5,064 and 7,598 bushels respectively. Of the total quantity in store viz 37,874,301 bushels the following were held by the different Prairie Provinces.-

The receipts of wheat at Country Elevators were 4,233,109 bushels and the shipments 3,894,089 bushels. The Platform Loadings for nine days ending November 30th, 1921, were as follows.- Wheat 627,854 bushels and others 294,589 bushels.

The Interior Terminal Elevators show increases in wheat of 155,744 bushels; oats, 44,462 bushels; barley, 95 bushels; flax 90 bushels and rye, 1,238 bushels.

In the Public and Private Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur decreases are shown in all grains; wheat, 4,404,486 bushels; oats, 658,952 bushels; barley, 388,276 bushels; flax, 46,264 bushels and rye, 108,886 bushels. The receipts of all grains were 8,140,051 bushels and the shipments by vessel 13,332,121 bushels and by rail 414,794 bushels.

The Private Terminal Elevators at Winnipeg show an increase in wheat of 274,611 bushels. Oats and Barley indicate decreases of 1,061 and 3,025 bushels respectively.

In the Public Elevators in the East increases are shown in wheat of 303,003 bushels; barley, 176,419 bushels and rye, 14,671 bushels. Oats and flax indicate decreases of 163,493 and 7,143 bushels respectively. The receipts of wheat were 2,321,406 bushels by vessel and 628,431 bushels by rail while the shipments were 575,075 bushels by vessel and 2,220,293 bushels by rail.

The Quantity of U. S. Grain in Store at the Public Elevators in the East was 3,926,302 bushels compared with 2,221,140 bushels last year. The bulk of the former was made up of wheat and corn viz 867,526 and 2,327,547 bushels respectively.

In the U. S. Lake Ports increases are shown in wheat of 5,859,345 bushels; oats, 299,825 bushels and barley, 94,950 bushels.

In the U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports increases are shown in all grains; wheat, 427,478 bushels; oats, 242,103 bushels; barley, 28,132 bushels and rye, 236,789 bushels.
