CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 14th, 1921.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 14th, 1921, the quantity of grain in store at the different elevators throughout Canada has increased by 12,556,476 bushels made up as follows.- Wheat, 10,639,945 bushels; oats, 1,419,222 bushels; barley, 279,498 bushels; flax, 153,875 bushels and rye, 63,936 bushels.

In the Western Country Elevators increases are shown in wheat of 7,728,647 bushels; oats, 989,694 bushels; barley, 235,111 bushels; flax, 153,516 bushels and rye, 93,139 bushels. Of the total quantity in store viz 27,002,160 bushels the following were held by the different Prairie Provinces.-

The receipts of wheat at Country Elevators were 18,335,983 bushels and the shipments 10,890,848 bushels. The quantity loaded over the Loading Platforms for the week ending October 7th, 1921, was as follows.- Wheat, 1,408,924 bushels and other grains 374,049 bushels.

The Interior Terminal Elevators show increases in wheat of 57,446 bushels; barley, 2,000 bushels and rye, 1,517 bushels. Oats indicates a decrease of 27,003 bushels.

In the Public and Private Terminal Elevators at Fort William and Port Arthur increases are shown in wheat of 1,896,497 bushels; oats, 547,794 bushels; barley, 33,013 bushels and rye, 32,746 bushels. Flax indicates a decrease of 32,925 bushels. The receipts of all grains were 11,042,459 bushels and shipments by vessel 8,259,716 bushels and by rail 313,968 bushels.

The Private Terminal Elevators at Winnipeg show decreases in oats and barley of 2,004 and 9,497 bushels respectively while wheat shows an increase of 1,436 bushels and flax, 129 bushels.

In the Public Elevators in the East increases are shown in wheat of 992,734 bushels; flax, 35,335 bushels and rye, 57,102 bushels. Oats shows a decrease of 86,747 bushels and barley, 15,104 bushels. The receipts of wheat were 3,390,545 bushels by vessel and 825,198 bushels by rail while the shipments were 1,075,831 bushels by vessel and 1,635,562 bushels by rail.

The quantity of U. S. Grain in Store at Public Elevators in the East was 8,493,221 bushels compared with 1,814,185 last year. The bulk of the former was made up of wheat and corn viz 3,297,216 and 3,833,558 bushels respectively.

In the U.S. Lake Ports decreases are shown in wheat of 32,724 bushels; flax, 2,180 bushels and rye, 89,823 bushels. Barley indicates an increase of 33,975 bushels.

The U.S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports show decreases in wheat of 4,091 bushels; oats, 2,512 bushels and rye, 30,740 bushels.
