WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 4, 1939 decreased 849,377 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 76,486,091 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 95,000,144 bushels compared with 95,849,521 bushels for the previous week and 18,514,053 bushels for the week of August 5, 1938. The stocks of 95,000,144 bushels include 9,280,459 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 4, 1939 were 88,093,144 bushels compared with 89,282,521 bushels for the previous week and 17,403,053 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 7,800,000; Interior Terminals 8,685,606; Vancouver-New Westminster 6,445,250; Victoria 318,674; Churchill 2,511,870; Fort William and Port Arthur 15,590,695; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 29,198,286 and 10,861,748 bushels respectively.

Increases were indicated at Victoria of 7,993; Churchill 179,299; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,380,165 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,566,741 and 707,229 bushels respectively, while decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 885,000; Interior Elevators 369,098 and Vancouver-New Westminster 239,101 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,099,216 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,581,799 bushels for the week ending August 4, 1939 compared with 838,762 and 2,721,699 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,907,000 bushels, an increase of 340,000 bushels over the previous week when 6,567,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,315,000; Erie 1,029,000; Erie Canal 217,000; New York 403,000; New York Afloat 83,000 and Albany 3,860,000 bushels. Erie and New York showed increases of 309,000 and 236,000 bushels respectively, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 25,000; Buffalo Afloat 60,000; Erie Canal 117,000 and New York Afloat 3,000 bushels. Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,111,000 bushels, distributed as follows: Buffalo 565,000; Erie Canal 130,000; New York 166,000; New York Afloat 140,000 and Albany 110,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the period ending July 31, 1939 amounted to 1,279,609 bushels, a decrease of 701,697 bushels from the previous week when 1,981,306 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 620,402 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the period ending July 31, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 201,969 (218,768); Saskatchewan 461,317 (176,108); Alberta 616,323 (225,526) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-two weeks from August 1, 1938 to July 31, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 44,308,424 (38,347,664); Saskatchewan 117,640,160 (27,789,746); Alberta 128,494,322 (59,303,828) bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 31, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 290,442,906 and 125,441,238 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 4, 1939 amounted to 478,196 bushels. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 608,014 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 4, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 228,119 (256,184); Saskatchewan 121,665 (162,204); Alberta 128,412 (189,626) bushels.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 4, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,561,010 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 160,000 bushels. The total is 1,721,010 bushels as compared with 1,937,389 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 216,379 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,312,875 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 5, 1939 amounted to 9,070,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,202,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,032,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed increases over the previous week of 750,000 and 1,183,000 bushels respectively while Australian shipments were slightly lower, and Danubian shipments were 1,752,000 lower.
