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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 6, 1939 increased 19,937,694 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 140,952,451 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 306,364,555 bushels compared with 286,426,861 bushels for the previous week and 165,412,104 bushels for the week of October 7, 1938. The stocks of 306,364,555 bushels include 15,203,889 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 6, 1939 were 291,923,555 bushels compared with 274,840,861 bushels for the previous week and 162,114,104 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 100,630,000; Interior Terminals 19,051,898; Vancouver-New Westminster 4,040,368; Victoria 286,685; Churchill 2,157,783; Fort William and Port Arthur 70,903,371; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 33,053,423 and 20,018,113 bushels respectively.

Increases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 5,590,000; Interior Elevators 6,642,435; Fort William and Port Arthur 4,284,162; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 175,500 and 488,899 bushels respectively. Decreases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster of 104,221 bushels, while Victoria and Churchill remained unchanged.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 35,494,901 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 6,287,013 bushels for the week ending October 6, 1939 compared with 21,290,898 and 8,122,738 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,441,000 bushels, an increase of 2,855,000 bushels over the previous week when 11,586,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 4,024,000; Buffalo Afloat 788,000; Erie 1,485,000; Erie Canal 330,000; New York 4,263,000; New York Afloat 144,000; Albany 3,263,000; Philadelphia 126,000 and Baltimore 18,000 bushels. Increases were noted at Buffalo of 1,258,000; Buffalo Afloat 74,000; Erie 155,000; Erie Canal 68,000; New York 1,347,000; New York Afloat 144,000 and Philadelphia 126,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Albany and Baltimore of 102,000 and 215,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,298,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,755,000; Buffalo Afloat 95,000; Erie 240,000; Erie Canal 558,000; New York 296,000; New York Afloat 14,000 and Albany 340,000 bushels.

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Export Clearances

During the week ending October 6, 1939 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canadian and United States ports amounted to 2,548,013 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 123,000 bushels, totalling 2,671,013 bushels. This compared with 4,337,709 bushels for the corresponding week in 1938. The accumulated total for the period from August 1 to October 6, 1939, was 23,249,805 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 1,412,000 bushels amounting in all to 24,661,805 bushels compared with 25,724,397 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 6, 1939 amounted to 19,144,278 bushels, a decrease of 24,617,142 bushels over the previous week when 43,761,420 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 21,443,468 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 6, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 755,718 (856,033); Saskatchewan 12,184,673 (3,333,800); Alberta 6,203,807 (11,703,635) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the ten weeks from August 1, 1939 to October 6, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 45,579,076 (36,297,409); Saskatchewan 139,560,348 (73,662,187); Alberta 60,641,998 (73,376,390) bushels. For the ten weeks ending October 6, 1939 and the same period in 1938 245,731,422 and 183,335,986 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending October 7, 1939 amounted to 7,341,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,541,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,064,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,186,000 and 1,078,000 bushels. No report was received from Australia.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 88,295,000 bushels as compared with 108,960,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 40,152,000 bushels as compared with 43,880,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 31,767,000 bushels during the first ten weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 10,896,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.

According to the above weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 8.8 million bushels as compared with 10.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1938. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 4.4 million bushels in the same weeks last year.
