WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 20, 1939 increased 16,592,832 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 161,691,907 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 336,565,884 bushels compared with 319,973,052 bushels for the previous week and 174,873,977 bushels for the week of October 21, 1938. The stocks of 336,565,884 bushels include 14,917,949 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 20, 1939 were 321,381,884 bushels compared with 306,546,052 bushels for the previous week and 170,071,977 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 113,980,000; Interior Terminals 21,730,085; Vancouver-New Westminster 5,348,804; Victoria 291,285; Churchill 2,329,786; Fort William and Port Arthur 77,181,050; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 35,527,707 and 21,102,294 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 7,800,000; Interior Elevators 761,800; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,222,434; Victoria 4,766; Churchill 135,265; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,581,130 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 104,354 and 337,882 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 40,252,515 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,638,358 bushels for the week ending October 20, 1939 compared with 16,230,364 and 8,499,411 bushels for the same period last year.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,184,000 bushels, an increase of 1,757,000 bushels over the previous week when 13,427,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 3,724,000; Buffalo Afloat 374,000; Erie 1,539,000; Erie Canal 200,000; New York 4,279,000; New York Afloat 115,000; Albany 3,724,000; Philadelphia 16,000; Boston 1,078,000 and Baltimore 135,000 bushels. Increases were noted at Buffalo of 302,000; Buffalo Afloat 171,000; Erie 204,000; New York Afloat 35,000; Albany 152,000; Boston 1,031,000 and Baltimore 116,000 bushels, while Erie Canal and New York decreased 255,000 and 9,000 bushels respectively. Philadelphia remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,802,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,105,000; Buffalo Afloat 707,000; Erie 1,217,000; Erie Canal 779,000; New York 428,000; New York Afloat 72,000 and Albany 494,000 bushels.




Export Clearances

During the week ending October 20, 1939 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canadian and United States ports amounted to 1,783,960 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 290,000 bushels, totalling 2,073,960 bushels. This compared with 7,569,314 bushels for the corresponding week in 1938. The accumulated total for the period from August 1 to October 20, 1939 was 26,197,094 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 1,970,000 bushels amounting in all to 28,167,094 bushels compared with 36,903,330 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 20, 1939 amounted to 15,722,685 bushels, a decrease of 7,487,560 bushels from the previous week when 23,210,245 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 14,555,994 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 20, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 467,048 (568,570); Saskatchewan 9,200,694 (5,843,236); Alberta 6,054,943 (8,144,188) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twelve weeks from August 1, 1939 to October 20, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 47,175,405 (37,541,191); Saskatchewan 166,410,224 (83,767,568); Alberta 75,749,999 (87,725,775) bushels. For the twelve weeks ending October 20, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 289,335,628 and 209,034,534 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending October 21, 1939 amounted to 6,307,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,198,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,728,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 766,000 bushels while Argentine shipments decreased slightly. No report was received from Australia.


During the first twelve weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 100,777,000 bushels as compared with 131,592,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 44,406,000 bushels as compared with 56,752,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 37,123,000 bushels during the first twelve weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 12,112,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.

According to the above weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 8.4 million bushels as compared with 10.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1938. North American weekly average shipments were 3.7 million bushels as compared with 4.7 million bushels in the same weeks last year.




EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 348,777 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 452,149; corn 1,431,604 and soya beans 191,516 bushels, while oats, barley and rye decreased 829,814; 872,823 and 23,855 bushels respectively.


