WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 10, 1939 decreased 1,014,102 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 170,726,571 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 350,471,061 bushels compared with 351,485,163 bushels for the previous week and 179,744,490 bushels for the week of November 11, 1938. The stocks of 350,471,061 bushels include 14,500,603 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending November 10, 1939 were 333,026,061 bushels compared with 335,367,163 bushels for the previous week and 174,323,490 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 133,890,000; Interior Terminals 21,632,648; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,288,260; Victoria 343,909; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 76,914,779; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 36,706,624 and 19,802,536 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 3,920,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 354,714; Churchill 1,624; Fort William and Port Arthur 175,890 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,255,752 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Elevators of 372,249 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 994,234 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 27,073,187 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,889,533 bushels for the week ending November 10, 1939 compared with 10,075,523 and 6,864,453 bushels for the same period last year.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,445,000 bushels, an increase of 1,327,000 bushels over the previous week when 16,118,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 4,102,000; Erie 1,905,000; Erie Canal 75,000; New York 4,472,000; Albany 4,279,000; Philadelphia 343,000; Boston 1,706,000 and Baltimore 563,000 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 510,000; Erie 174,000; New York 384,000; Philadelphia 134,000; Boston 80,000 and Baltimore 305,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 160,000; Erie Canal 25,000 and Albany 75,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,421,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 623,000; Buffalo Afloat 613,000; Erie 1,758,000; Erie Canal 373,000; New York 662,000; New York Afloat 287,000 and Albany 1,105,000 bushels.



Export Clearances

During the week ending November 10, 1939 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canadian and United States ports amounted to 3,184,625 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 230,000 bushels, totalling 3,414,625 bushels. This compared with 4,446,266 bushels for the corresponding week in 1938. The accumulated total for the period from August 1 to November 10, 1939 was 32,535,659 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 2,764,000 bushels amounting in all to 35,299,659 bushels compared with 52,191,328 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 10, 1939 amounted to 7,383,193 bushels, a decrease of 2,082,753 bushels from the previous week when 9,475,946 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,502,145 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 10, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 376,727 (357,397); Saskatchewan 4,065,650 (1,496,553); Alberta 2,940,816 (2,648,195) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifteen weeks from August 1, 1939 to November 10, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 48,982,103 (38,923,036); Saskatchewan 184,338,926 (93,905,210); Alberta 89,606,224 (101,301,528) bushels. For the fifteen weeks ending November 10, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 322,927,253 and 234,129,774 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending November 11, 1939 amounted to 10,617,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,212,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,448,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,507,000 bushels while Argentine shipments increased 1,258,000 bushels. No report was received from Australia.


During the first fifteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 125,917,000 bushels as compared with 169,288,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 52,047,000 bushels as compared with 76,792,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 50,126,000 bushels during the first fifteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 15,520,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.

North American weekly average shipments were 3.5 million bushels as compared with 5.1 million bushels in the same weeks last year.


