WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 8, 1939 decreased 587,874 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 178,662,318 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 349,590,136 bushels compared with 350,178,010 bushels for the previous week and 170,927,818 bushels for the week of December 9, 1938. The stocks of 349,590,136 bushels include 14,259,580 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 8, 1939 were 313,604,080 bushels compared with 316,295,677 bushels for the previous week and 162,326,818 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 146,130,000; Interior Terminals 22,220,325; Vancouver-New Westminster 14,251,921; Victoria 603,692; Prince Rupert 398,759; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 45,253,956; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 44,454,500 and 19,697,624 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 720,000; Interior Terminals 176,177; Vancouver-New Westminster 486,323; Victoria 57,759; Prince Rupert 131,327 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 8,389,795 and 550,176 bushels respectively, while Fort William and Port Arthur decreased 5,870,417 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 10,289,066 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 7,819,652 bushels for the week ending December 9, 1939 compared with 6,915,531 and 332,354 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 35,986,056 bushels, an increase of 2,103,723 bushels over the previous week when 33,882,333 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,312,056; Buffalo 1,837,000; Buffalo Afloat 6,510,000; Erie 510,000; New York 7,164,000; Albany 6,250,000; Philadelphia 2,855,000; Boston 1,822,000 and Baltimore 6,726,000 bushels.

Increases were noted at Duluth of 1,172,723; New York 1,131,000; Albany 718,000 and Baltimore 1,340,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 236,000; Buffalo Afloat 613,000; Erie 1,238,000; Erie Canal 61,000; Philadelphia 7,000 and Boston 113,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,601,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 777,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,763,000; Erie 2,151,000; New York 863,000; New York Afloat 147,000; Albany 851,000 and Philadelphia 49,000 bushels.

SECTION 106 REPORT

The following is a list of historic landmarks, historic and prehistoric structures, and other historic objects within the United States, as identified by the Secretary of the Interior.

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Export Clearances

During the week ending December 8, 1939 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 3,979,525 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 82,000 bushels, totalling 4,061,525 bushels. This compared with 1,647,921 bushels for the corresponding week in 1938. The accumulated total for the period from August 1 to December 8, 1939 was 48,391,633 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 3,730,818 bushels amounting in all to 52,122,451 bushels compared with 67,804,971 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 8, 1939 amounted to 4,689,191 bushels, a decrease of 2,400,220 bushels from the previous week when 7,089,411 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,968,568 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 8, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 59,086 (199,702); Saskatchewan 2,031,156 (1,109,840); Alberta 2,598,949 (1,659,026) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nineteen weeks from August 1, 1939 to December 8, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 50,115,081 (39,907,402); Saskatchewan 198,368,913 (99,645,584); Alberta 104,849,851 (109,448,907) bushels. For the nineteen weeks ending December 8, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 353,333,845 and 249,001,893 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 9, 1939 amounted to 11,021,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,213,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,192,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,761,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 225,000 bushels.

During the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 168,290,000 bushels as compared with 212,576,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 71,713,000 bushels as compared with 96,176,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 65,889,000 bushels during the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 18,480,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.
