WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 11, 1939 decreased 2,456,712 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 74,909,095 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 92,543,432 bushels compared with 95,000,144 bushels for the previous week and 17,634,337 bushels for the week of August 12, 1938. The stocks of 92,543,432 bushels include 9,315,334 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 11, 1939 were 85,683,432 bushels compared with 88,093,144 bushels for the previous week and 16,867,337 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 8,145,000; Interior Terminals 8,359,963; Vancouver-New Westminster 5,445,968; Victoria 318,674; Churchill 2,552,252; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,423,699; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 29,828,445 and 11,221,459 bushels respectively.

Increases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 345,000; Churchill 40,382 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 630,159 and 359,711 bushels respectively, while decreases were noted at Interior Elevators of 325,643; Vancouver-New Westminster 999,282 and Fort William and Port Arthur 3,166,996 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,756,973 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,630,999 bushels for the week ending August 11, 1939 compared with 1,550,055 and 1,840,966 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES


Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,860,000 bushels, a decrease of 47,000 bushels over the previous week when 6,907,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,222,000; Erie 1,029,000; Erie Canal 366,000; New York 450,000; New York Afloat 45,000 and Albany 3,748,000 bushels. Erie Canal and New York showed increases of 149,000 and 47,000 bushels respectively, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 93,000, New York Afloat 38,000 and Albany 112,000 bushels. Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 767,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 217,000; Erie Canal 343,000; New York 7,000; New York Afloat 110,000 and Albany 90,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 11, 1939 amounted to 1,866,789 bushels, an increase of 1,185,460 bushels from the previous week when 681,329 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,231,338 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 11, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 1,553,582 (1,295,881); Saskatchewan 66,758 (408,205); Alberta 246,449 (527,252) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the two weeks from August 1, 1939 to August 11, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 1,954,511 (1,552,065); Saskatchewan 210,180 (570,409); Alberta 383,427 (716,878) bushels. For the two weeks ending August 11, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 2,548,118 and 2,839,352 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 11, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,460,263 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 96,000 bushels. The total is 3,556,263 bushels compared with 1,721,010 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,835,253 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,674,619 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending August 12, 1939 amounted to 10,401,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,070,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,272,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed increases over the previous week of 1,178,000 and 306,000 bushels respectively while Australian shipments were slightly lower.




