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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 22, 1939 increased 1,211,028 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 183,349,487 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 352,621,802 bushels compared with 351,410,774 bushels for the previous week and 169,272,315 bushels for the week of December 23, 1938. The stocks of 352,621,802 bushels include 13,593,903 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 22, 1939 were 313,498,367 bushels compared with 313,329,181 bushels for the previous week and 161,135,315 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 146,500,000; Interior Terminals 22,575,726: Vancouver-New Westminster 14,955,426: Victoria 761,367: Prince Rupert 741,382: Churchill 2,484,585: Fort William and Port Arthur 47,028,906: Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 49,040,982 and 19,670,907 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 282,647: Vancouver-New Westminster 343,559: Victoria 69,148: Prince Rupert 88,255: Fort William and Port Arthur 2,476,487: and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 68,940 bushels, while Country Elevators and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports decreased 600,000 and 724,175 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 9,739,086 bushels for the week ending December 22, 1939 compared with 4,146,804 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,123,435 bushels, an increase of 1,041,842 bushels over the previous week when 38,081,593 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,689,589: Buffalo 3,999,000; Buffalo Afloat 4,055,000; Erie 25,000; New York 8,489,000; Albany 6,783,000; Philadelphia 2,855,000; Boston 1,842,000; Portland 641,846 and Baltimore 7,714,000 bushels.

Increases were noted at Duluth of 51,852; Buffalo 805,000; New York 589,000; Baltimore 554,000 and Portland 15,990 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 898,000 and Boston 76,000 bushels. Erie, Albany and Philadelphia remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,137,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 872,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,425,000; Erie 1,949,000; New York 801,000; New York Afloat 147,000; Albany 851,000 and Philadelphia 92,000 bushels.





### Export Clearances

During the week ending December 22, 1939 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 2,830,486 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 123,000 bushels, totalling 2,953,486 bushels. This compared with 1,953,867 bushels for the corresponding week in 1938. The accumulated total for the period from August 1 to December 22, 1939 was 52,082,596 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 4,011,818 bushels amounting in all to 56,094,414 bushels compared with 70,667,799 bushels a year ago.

### Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 22, 1939 amounted to 2,796,645 bushels, a decrease of 1,285,365 bushels from the previous week when 4,082,010 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,936,373 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 22, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 85,746 (116,285): Saskatchewan 1,090,817 (744,807): Alberta 1,620,083 (1,075,281) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-one weeks from August 1, 1939 to December 22, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 49,980,659 (40,151,320): Saskatchewan 201,808,940 (101,303,058): Alberta 109,167,397 (111,710,720) bushels. For the twenty-one weeks ending December 22, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 360,956,996 and 253,165,098 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 23, 1939 amounted to 9,076,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,564,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,240,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,247,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 3,335,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 183,936,000 bushels as compared with 229,144,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were 75,793,000 bushels as compared with 101,816,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 74,135,000 bushels during the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 20,408,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.
