WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 9, 1940 decreased 3,431,724 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 178,031,377 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 332,204,607 bushels compared with 335,636,331 bushels for the previous week and 154,173,230 bushels for the week of February 10, 1939. The stocks of 332,204,607 bushels include 12,774,693 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 9, 1940 were 299,823,179 bushels compared with 301,433,897 bushels for the previous week and 148,714,230 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 124,955,000; Interior Terminals 22,293,601; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,635,952; Victoria 782,781; Prince Rupert 1,132,471; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 66,172,911; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 35,916,691 and 18,161,031 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 212,323; Vancouver-New Westminster 155,779; Victoria 8,611; Prince Rupert 5,972; Fort William and Port Arthur 6,190,701 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 566,372 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 4,735,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,085,518 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 11,288,156 bushels for the week ending February 9, 1940 compared with 1,796,941 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,381,428 bushels, a decrease of 1,821,006 bushels from the previous week when 34,202,434 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 3,663,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,923,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 2,692,000; Albany 7,598,000; Philadelphia 2,084,000; Boston 1,782,000; Portland 705,232 and Baltimore 7,143,000 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 201,000; Buffalo Afloat 174,000; New York 817,000; Philadelphia 431,000 and Baltimore 304,000 bushels, while Boston and Portland increased 77,000 and 28,994 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,459,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 410,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,435,000; Erie 890,000; New York 480,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 126,000; Boston 162,000 and Baltimore 87,000 bushels.



Export Clearances

During the week ending February 9, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 2,654,358 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 228,000 bushels, totalling 2,882,358 bushels. This compared with 1,287,031 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to February 9, 1940 was 74,905,040 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 5,275,981 bushels amounting in all to 80,181,021 bushels compared with 84,917,820 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 9, 1940 amounted to 1,130,672 bushels, an increase of 187,739 bushels from the previous week when 942,933 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 593,952 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 9, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 46,185 (66,942); Saskatchewan 525,924 (152,027); Alberta 558,563 (374,983) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-eight weeks from August 1, 1939 to February 9, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 50,762,801 (40,681,033); Saskatchewan 205,147,599 (103,718,465); Alberta 113,024,571 (115,846,419) bushels. For the twenty-eight weeks ending February 9, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 368,934,971 and 260,245,917 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending February 10, 1940 amounted to 7,313,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,939,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,168,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 378,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 472,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 239,648,000 bushels as compared with 309,256,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were 102,712,000 bushels as compared with 134,864,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39. Argentine shipments amounted to 94,992,000 bushels during the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 34,352,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39.

According to the above, weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 8.6 million bushels as compared with 11.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1938-39. North American weekly average shipments were 3.7 million bushels as compared with 4.8 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,531,238 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in oats of 442,880; rye 45; corn 2,645,323 and soya beans 29,632 bushels, while wheat and barley increased 582,570 and 4,072 bushels respectively.


