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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 16, 1940 decreased 2,180,561 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 178,391,335 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 330,024,046 bushels compared with 332,204,607 bushels for the previous week and 151,632,711 bushels for the week of February 17, 1939. The stocks of 330,024,046 bushels include 12,667,495 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 16, 1940 were 298,938,621 bushels compared with 299,823,179 bushels for the previous week and 146,938,711 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 122,540,000; Interior Terminals 22,745,602; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,188,192; Victoria 793,844; Prince Rupert 1,136,107; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 71,256,387; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 34,630,321 and 18,518,841 bushels respectively.

Increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 452,001; Victoria 11,063; Prince Rupert 3,636; Fort William and Port Arthur 5,083,476 and Eastern Elevators S.P. 357,810 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,415,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 447,760 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,286,370 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 8,644,742 bushels for the week ending February 16, 1940 compared with 1,904,564 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,085,425 bushels, a decrease of 1,296,003 bushels from the previous week when 32,381,428 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 3,650,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,571,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 2,260,000; Albany 7,598,000; Philadelphia 1,993,000; Boston 1,746,000; Portland 535,229 and Baltimore 6,941,000 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 13,000; Buffalo Afloat 352,000; New York 432,000; Philadelphia 91,000; Boston 36,000; Baltimore 202,000 and Portland 170,003 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,694,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 382,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,945,000; Erie 771,000; New York 371,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 92,000; Boston 208,000 and Baltimore 56,000 bushels.



Export Clearances

During the week ending February 16, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 2,767,111 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 186,000 bushels, totalling 2,953,111 bushels. This compared with 1,801,663 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to February 16, 1940 was 77,672,151 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 5,465,806 bushels amounting in all to 83,137,957 bushels compared with 86,719,483 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 16, 1940 amounted to 1,357,693 bushels, an increase of 59,052 bushels over the previous week when 1,298,641 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 313,052 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 16, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 67,684 (33,697): Saskatchewan 674,781 (132,455): Alberta 615,228 (146,900) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-nine weeks from August 1, 1939 to February 16, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 50,294,995 (40,714,730): Saskatchewan 206,279,700 (103,850,920); Alberta 113,820,066 (115,993,319) bushels. For the twenty-nine weeks ending February 16, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 370,394,761 and 260,558,969 bushels were received from the farms.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,435,589 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in oats of 382,681; rye 45; corn 2,665,135 and soya beans 30,967 bushels, while wheat and barley increased 639,563 and 3,676 bushels respectively.
