WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 18, 1939 increased 3,034,981 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 72,246,750 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 95,578,413 bushels compared with 92,543,432 bushels for the previous week and 23,331,663 bushels for the week of August 19, 1938. The stocks of 95,578,413 bushels include 9,576,076 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 18, 1939 were 88,996,413 bushels compared with 85,683,432 bushels for the previous week and 22,093,663 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 10,830,000; Interior Terminals 8,173,068; Vancouver-New Westminster 5,012,199; Victoria 270,056; Churchill 2,060,415; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,208,667; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 31,220,879 and 12,189,213 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Interior Elevators of 186,895; Vancouver-New Westminster 433,769; Victoria 48,618; Churchill 491,837 and Fort William and Port Arthur 215,032 bushels, while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,685,000 and Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,392,434 and 967,754 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,333,063 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,698,853 bushels for the week ending August 18, 1939 compared with 4,018,590 and 1,503,203 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,582,000 bushels, a decrease of 278,000 bushels over the previous week when 6,860,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,209,000; Erie 1,029,000; Erie Canal 59,000; New York 529,000; New York Afloat 89,000 and Albany 3,667,000 bushels. Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 13,000; Erie Canal 307,000 and Albany 81,000 bushels, while New York and New York Afloat increased 79,000 and 44,000 bushels respectively. Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,238,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 69,000; Buffalo Afloat 100,000; Erie Canal 590,000; New York 35,000; New York Afloat 435,000 and Albany 9,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 18, 1939 amounted to 4,529,990 bushels, an increase of 1,919,123 bushels from the previous week when 2,610,867 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,562,985 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 18, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 2,645,713 (4,263,467); Saskatchewan 989,478 (1,314,291); Alberta 894,799 (985,227) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the two weeks from August 1, 1939 to August 18, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 5,269,538 (5,815,532) Saskatchewan 1,254,644 (1,884,700); Alberta 1,298,004 (1,702,105) bushels. For the three weeks ending August 18, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 7,822,186 and 9,402,337 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

STATE OF THE LAND REVENUE

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 18, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,950,136 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 332,000 bushels. The total is 3,282,136 bushels compared with 3,556,263 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 274,127 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,870,910 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 19, 1939 amounted to 10,690,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,401,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,856,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Australian shipments showed increases over the previous week of 738,000 and 274,000 bushels respectively while Argentine shipments were lower by 867,000 bushels.

During the first three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 30,099,000 bushels as compared with 35,160,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 14,458,000 bushels as compared with 12,856,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argentine shipments amounted to 9,447,000 bushels during the first three weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 2,752,000 bushels for the same period in 1938.
