WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 1, 1940 decreased 5,922,477 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 173,057,484 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 319,845,204 bushels compared with 325,767,681 bushels for the previous week and 146,694,963 bushels for the week of March 3, 1939. The stocks of 319,845,204 bushels include 11,942,403 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 1, 1940 were 292,089,210 bushels compared with 296,349,256 bushels for the previous week and 143,044,963 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 120,035,000; Interior Terminals 22,738,649; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,671,945 Victoria 807,644; Prince Rupert 1,136,107; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 77,033,923; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 29,241,414 and 17,501,383 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 795,000; Interior Terminals 70,084; Vancouver-New Westminster 181,884 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,270,941 and 1,037,550 bushels respectively, while Fort William and Port Arthur increased 2,112,997 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,438,560 bushels for the week ending March 1, 1940 compared with 1,468,085 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,755,994 bushels, a decrease of 1,662,431 bushels from the previous week when 29,418,425 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 2,625,00C; Buffalo Afloat 1,640,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 1,738,000; Albany 7,598,000; Philadelphia 1,760,000; Boston 1,639,000; Portland 243,798 and Baltimore 6,721,000 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 627,000; Buffalo Afloat 195,000; New York 385,000; Philadelphia 31,000; Boston 275,000 and Portland 233,431 bushels while Erie and Baltimore increased 25,000 and 59,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,650,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 295,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,388,000; Erie 605,000; New York 406,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 48,000; Boston 15,000 and Baltimore 24,000 bushels.

THE TOTAL OF THE RESIDENCE OF THE PARTY OF T

During the week ending March 1, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 4,359,780 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 167,000 bushels, totalling 4,526,780 bushels. This compared with 2,522,293 bushels for the corrosponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to March 1, 1940 was 84,843,259 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 5,864,806 bushels amounting in all to 90,708,065 bushels compared with 91,100,764 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 1, 1940 amounted to 1,273,105 bushels, a decrease of 157,954 bushels from the previous week when 1,431,059 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,267,806 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 1, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 117,659 (95,039); Saskatchewan 616,005 (432,678); Alberta 539,441 (740,089) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-one weeks from August 1, 1939 to March 1, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939:
Manitoba 50,496,001 (40,856,331); Saskatchewan 207,587,541 (104,458,875); Alberta 115,071,941 (117,092,816) bushels. For the thirty-one weeks ending March 1, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 373,155,483 and 262,408,022 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending March 2, 1940 amounted to 7,230,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,011,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,224,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 40,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 1,021,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments wore 263,421,000 bushels as compared with 345,400,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were 115,715,000 bushels as compared with 151,672,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39. Argentine shipments amounted to 103,378,000 bushels during the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 40,368,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39.
