WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 8, 1940 decreased 2,284,027 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 172,462,936 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 317,561,177 bushels compared with 319,845,204 bushels for the previous week and 145,098,241 bushels for the week of March 10, 1939. The stocks of 317,561,177 bushels include 11,324,623 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 8, 1940 were 291,178,708 bushels compared with 292,069,210 bushels for the previous week and 141,741,241 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 120,025,000; Interior Terminals 22,700,301; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,816,989; Victoria 567,200; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,484,585; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,005,758; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 25,113,611 and 18,046,153 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 10,000; Victoria 240,444; Prince Rupert 58 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 4,127,803 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Terminals of 52,252; Vancouver-New Westminster 145,044; Fort William and Port Arthur 971,835 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 544,770 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 7,192,462 bushels for the week ending March 8, 1940 compared with 2,009,344 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,382,469 bushels, a decrease of 1,373,525 bushels from the previous week when 27,755,994 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 2,511,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,389,000; Erie 422,000; Erie Afloat 637,347; New York 932,000; Albany 7,598,000; Philadelphia 2,009,000; Boston 1,499,000; Portland 548,245 and Baltimore 6,105,000 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 114,000; Buffalo Afloat 251,000; Erie Afloat 396,972; New York 806,000; Boston 140,000 and Baltimore 616,000 bushels, while increases were shown at Erie of 397,000; Philadelphia 249,000 and Portland 304,447 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,357,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 258,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,209,000; Erie 523,000; New York 388,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 48,000 and Boston 62,000 bushels.



Export Clearances

During the week ending March 8, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 4,618,474 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 297,000 bushels, totalling 4,915,474 bushels. This compared with 1,562,336 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to March 8, 1940 was 89,461,733 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 6,280,463 bushels amounting in all to 95,722,196 bushels compared with 92,663,100 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 8, 1940 amounted to 1,483,127 bushels, an increase of 140,340 bushels over the previous week when 1,342,787 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,350,226 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 8, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 84,130 (156,692); Saskatchewan 708,114 (583,209); Alberta 690,883 (610,325) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-two weeks from August 1, 1939 to March 8, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 50,582,106 (41,013,023); Saskatchewan 208,327,901 (105,042,084); Alberta 115,798,285 (117,703,141) bushels. For the thirty-two weeks ending March 8, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 374,708,292 and 263,758,248 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending March 9, 1940 amounted to 10,696,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,230,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,128,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 3,102,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 604,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments were 274,326,000 bushels as compared with 354,648,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were 123,088,000 bushels as compared with 156,208,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39. Argentine shipments amounted to 105,470,000 bushels during the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 42,464,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39.

According to the above, weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 8.6 million bushels as compared with 11.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1938-39. North American weekly average shipments were 3.8 million bushels as compared with 4.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,043,280 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in oats of 255,291; rye 54; corn 2,438,688 and soya beans 26,866 bushels, while wheat and barley increased 874,693 and 2,926 bushels respectively.


