WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 5, 1940 increased 274,580 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 172,197,030 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 310,995,452 bushels compared with 310,720,872 bushels for the previous week and 138,798,422 bushels for the week of April 7, 1939. The stocks of 310,995,452 bushels include 11,193,280 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending April 5, 1940 were 289,358,146 bushels compared with 288,391,777 bushels for the previous week and 137,231,422 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 120,140,000; Interior Terminals 22,460,560; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,664,045; Victoria 580,611; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 80,271,963; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 19,037,994 and 18,000,473 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 775,000; Interior Terminals 369,330; Vancouver-New Westminster 83,006 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,140,392 bushels while increases were shown at Victoria of 11,907; Churchill 10,025; Fort William and Port Arthur 500,204 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,361 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 9,571,841 bushels for the week ending April 5, 1940 compared with 5,749,682 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,637,306 bushels, a decrease of 691,789 bushels from the previous week when 22,329,095 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 2,163,000; Buffalo Afloat 283,000; Erie 662,000; New York 524,000; Albany 7,598,000; Philadelphia 1,795,509; Boston 1,131,387; Portland 952,796 and Baltimore 3,795,737 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 205,000; Erie Afloat 637,347 and Baltimore 670,995 bushels, while increases were shown at Erie of 637,000; New York 88,000; Philadelphia 64,343 and Boston 32,210 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,567,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 219,000; Buffalo Afloat 228,000; Erie 348,000; New York 236,000; Albany 512,000 and Philadelphia 24,000 bushels.

Export Clearances

During the week ending April 5, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 3,163,395 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 115,000 bushels, totalling 3,278,395 bushels. This compared with 1,435,758 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to April 5, 1940 was 104,027,611 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 6,817,463 bushels amounting in all to 110,845,074 bushels compared with 98,026,710 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 5, 1940 amounted to 1,815,013 bushels, an increase of 7,171 bushels over the previous week when 1,807,842 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 988,796 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 5, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 131,391 (129,701); Saskatchewan 876,388 (328,571); Alberta 807,234 (530,524) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-six weeks from August 1, 1939 to April 5, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 51,203,472 (41,535,624); Saskatchewan 212,364,532 (106,845,488); Alberta 118,791,099 (119,905,081) bushels. For the thirty-six weeks ending April 5, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 382,359,103 and 268,286,193 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending April 6, 1940 amounted to 9,720,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,091,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,752,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 364,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 2,201,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments were 334,891,000 bushels as compared with 396,536,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were 145,688,000 bushels as compared with 170,320,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39. Argentine shipments amounted to 115,915,000 bushels during the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 54,896,000 bushels for the same period in 1938-39.


