WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 17, 1940 decreased 5,304,766 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 164,647,128 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 288,249,190 bushels compared with 293,553,956 bushels for the previous week and 123,602,062 bushels for the week of May 19, 1939. The stocks of 288,249,190 bushels include 9,164,837 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 17, 1940 were 265,346,770 bushels compared with 271,977,763 bushels for the previous week and 121,617,062 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 97,665,000; Interior Terminals 19,214,637; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,853,295; Victoria 612,737; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 67,813,454; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 27,676,825 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 19,062,552 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 435,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 70,323; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,111,865 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,633,423 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Terminals of 7,528 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 4,494,545 bushels.

For the week ending May 17, 1940, the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 7,024,006 bushels, and in transit by rail 6,788,625, compared with 4,935,976 in transit on the lakes and 10,258,836 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,302,695 bushels, an increase of 1,521,978 bushels over the previous week when 18,780,717 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 5,915,000; Buffalo Afloat 459,000; Erie 2,054,000; Chicago Afloat 66,000; New York 519,000; New York Afloat 68,000; Albany 4,472,000; Philadelphia 1,681,312; Boston 1,113,093; Portland 2,636 and Baltimore 1,220,777 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 465,000; Buffalo Afloat 236,000; Chicago Afloat 66,000; New York Afloat 68,000; Albany 175,000; Philadelphia 33,897; Boston 530,078 and Baltimore 33,003 bushels, while decreases were shown at Erie Canal of 50,000 and New York 35,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,985,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 460,000; Buffalo Afloat 246,000; Erie 110,000; Erie Canal 525,000; New York 149,000 and Albany 495,000 bushels.



Export Clearances

During the week ending May 17, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 4,856,222 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 267,000 bushels, totalling 5,123,222 bushels. This compared with 3,647,808 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to May 17, 1940 was 125,661,625 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 7,926,151 bushels amounting in all to 133,590,776 bushels compared with 110,449,096 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 17, 1940 amounted to 1,589,672 bushels, a decrease of 92,851 bushels from the previous week when 1,682,523 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,288,097 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 17, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 158,697 (174,775); Saskatchewan 857,589 (654,227); Alberta 573,386 (459,095) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-two weeks from August 1, 1939 to May 17, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 51,628,236, (42,534,692); Saskatchewan 217,897,935, (110,376,496); Alberta 121,280,202, (122,552,243) bushels. For the forty-two weeks ending May 17, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 390,806,373 and 275,463,431 bushels were received from the farms.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 571,155 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in oats of 81,601; barley 252,699; rye 54 and soya beans 345,180 bushels, while wheat and corn increased 52,863 and 55,516 bushels respectively.
