#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 14, 1940 decreased 116,188 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 169,293,693 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 279,508,047 bushels compared with 279,624,235 bushels for the previous week and 110,214,354 bushels for the week of June 16, 1939. The stocks of 279,508,047 bushels include 8,919,392 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending June 14, 1940 were 256,965,226 bushels compared with 257,256,079 bushels for the previous week and 106,366,354 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 84,065,000; Interior Terminals 18,624,484; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,386,142; Victoria 612,474; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 54,839,540; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 34,604,804 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,916,029.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 5,505,000; Interior Terminals 196,269; Vancouver-New Westminster 82,581 and Fort William and Port Arthur 467,831 bushels, while increases were shown at Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 858,448 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,218,541 bushels.

For the week ending June 14, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 4,657,880 bushels and in transit by rail 19,628,214; compared with 4,810,054 in transit on the lakes and 3,096,146 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.



#### CANADIAN THEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,542,821 bushels, an increase of 174,665 bushels over the previous week when 22,368,156 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 4,880,000; Buffalo Afloat 426,000; Erie 2,039,000; Erie Canal 468,000; Chicago 47,000; New York 668,000; New York Afloat 263,000; Albany 4,688,000; Philadelphia 1,387,098; Boston 2,236,117; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,124,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 373,207 bushels.

Increases were shown at Buffalo of 278,000; Buffalo Afloat 426,000; New York 123,000; New York Afloat 34,000; Albany 69,000; Boston 16,861 and Portland 175,665 bushels, while decreases were noted at Erie of 14,000; Erie Canal 58,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 875,861 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,848,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 177,000; Buffalo Afloat 221,000; Erie 400,000; Erie Canal 320,000; New York 47,000 and Albany 2,683,000 bushels.




#### Export Clearances

During the week ending June 14, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada and United States ports amounted to 1,839,739 bushels while the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 232,000 bushels, totalling 2,071,739 bushels. This compared with 3,335,182 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to June 14, 1940 was 138,783,890 bushels and the imports into the United States for the same period were 8,754,716 bushels amounting in all to 147,538,606 bushels compared with 123,676,974 bushels a year ago.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 14, 1940 amounted to 2,065,624 bushels, a decrease of 264,973 bushels from the previous week when 2,330,597 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,086,973 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 14, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 114,045 (215,785); Saskatchewan 1,165,561 (440,042); Alberta 786,018 (431,146) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-six weeks from August 1,1939 to June 14, 1940 as c mpared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939:
Manitoba 51,941,441 (43,287,896); Saskatchewan 222,385,210 (112,667.597);
Alberta 123,930,192 (124,431,443) bushels. For the forty-six weeks ending June 14, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 398,256,843 and 280,386,936 bushels were received from the farms.



EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,199,229 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in oats of 171,299; barley 44,518; corn 2,057,841 and soya beans 1,312 bushels, while wheat and rye increased 75,559 and 182 bushels respectively.
