WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 26, 1940 decreased 759,736 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 185,508,901 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 281,358,422 bushels compared with 282,118,158 bushels for the previous week and 95,849,521 bushels for the week of July 28, 1939. The stocks of 281,358,422 bushels include 8,612,563 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN THEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending July 26, 1940 were 256,135,572 bushels compared with 256,445,170 bushels for the previous week and 89,282,521 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 53,420,000; Interior Terminals 19,311,793; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,307,212; Victoria 612, 41; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,528,466; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 38,893,098 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,652,422 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 3,260,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 986,758 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 677,963 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Terminals of 729,481; Vancouver-New Westminster 108,606; Victoria 614 and Fort William and Port Arthur 3,060,301 bushels.

For the week ending July 26, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,065,796 bushels and in transit by rail 23,713,685; compared with 5,819,530 in transit on the lakes and 4,399,090 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,222,850 bushels, a decrease of 450,138 bushels from the previous week when 25,672,988 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 5,117,000; Erie 2,010,000; Erie Canal 360,000; Chicago 45,000; New York 559,000; New York Afloat 174,000; Albany 6,492,000; Philadelphia 1,064,189; Boston 2,275,979; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,098,283 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 421,000; Erie Canal 216,000; Chicago 2,000; Philadelphia 87,425 and In Transit U.S.A. 405,713 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 20,000; New York 26,000; New York Afloat 57,000 and Albany 579,000

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,567,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,340,000; Buffalo Afloat 60,000; Erie 720,000; Erie Canal 334,000; New York 167,000; New York Afloat 86,000 and Albany 3,860,000 bushels,

Export Clearances

During the week ending July 26, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada amounted to 2,938,216 bushels. This compared with 1,616,680 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1939 to July 26, 1940 was 151,856,469 bushels compared with 128,053,499 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 26, 1940 amounted to 4,003,811 bushels, a decrease of 155,184 bushels from the revised figure of the previous week when 4,158,995 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,279,609 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 26, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 239,677 (201,969); Saskatchewan 2,157,850 (461,317); Alberta 1,606,284 (616,323) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-two weeks from August 1, 1939 to July 26, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 53,291,331 (44,308,424); Saskatchewan 235,813,540 (117,640,160); Alberta 132,423,120 (128,494,322) bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 26, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 421,527,991 and 290,442,906 bushels were received from the farms.


