#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 15, 1939 increases 41,221,530 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 118,946,573 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 221,952,832 bushels compared with 180,731,302 bushels for the previous week and 103,006,259 bushels for the week of September 16, 1938. The stocks of 221,952,832 bushels include 14,608,445 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 15, 1939 were 213,676,832 bushels compared with 173,401,302 bushels for the previous week and 101,657,259 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,276,000 bushels an increase of 946,000 bushels over the previous week when 7,330,000 bushels were reported.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 15, 1939 amounted to 38,418,578 bushels, an increase of 4,119,768 bushels over the previous week when 42,538,346 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 20,725,068 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 15, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938:
Manitoba 3,834,726 (2,822,437); Saskatchewan 26,502,085 (8,499,151); Alberta 8,081,767 (9,403,480) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seven weeks from August 1, 1939 to September 15, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 37,417,521 (32,546,785); Saskatchewan 75,498,168 (40,384,432); Alberta. 27,761,442 (26,571,556) bushels. For the seven weeks ending September 15, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 140,677,131 and 99,502,773 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending September 16, 1939 amounted to 6,209,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,267,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,960,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases from the previous week of 2,455,000 and 1,835,000 bushels respectively. No report was received from Australia.

During the first seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 65,119,000 bushels as compared with 77,816,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 28,281,000 bushels as compared with 28,272,000 bushels for the same period in 1938. Argantine shipments amounted to 23,970,000 bushels during the first seven weeks of the present crop year as compared with only 7,648,000 bushels for the same period in 1938:




