WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 11, 1940 increased 10,274,153 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 101,625,566 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 421,598,618 bushels compared with 411,324,465 bushels for the previous week and 319,973,052 bushels for the week of October 13, 1939. The stocks of 421,598,618 bushels include 9,323,523 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 11, 1940 were 383,732,546 bushels compared with 373,512,622 bushels for the previous week and 306,546,052 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 161,855,000; Interior Terminals 23,547,961; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,198,644; Victoria 560,372; Prince Rupert 1,135,164; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 82,899,291; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 43,967,136 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,932,909 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 9,325,000; Victoria 23,485; Churchill 5,594; Fort William and Port Arthur 208,534 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 564,437 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 215,973; Vancouver-New Westminster 24,625 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 623,417 bushels.

For the week ending October 11, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 4,801,963 bushels and in transit by rail 25,116,710 compared with 3,720,658 in transit on the lakes and 37,282,014 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 37,866,072 bushels, an increase of 54,229 bushels over the previous week when 37,811,843 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 7,006,282; Buffalo 6,840,000; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 474,000; Chicago 29,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,260,000; New York Afloat 399,000; Albany 8,874,000; Philadelphia 1,118,952; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,234,706 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,846,673 bushels.

Increases were shown at Duluth of 273,968; Buffalo 725,000; Erie Canal 279,000; New York 34,000; Philadelphia 101,430 and Baltimore 150,329 bushels, while decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat 393,000; New York Afloat 255,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 861,498 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,427,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 3,422,000; Buffalo Afloat 203,000; Erie 1,335,000; Erie Canal 455,000; New York 4,288,000; New York Afloat 80,000; Albany 3,562,000; Baltimore 19,000; Boston 47,000 and Philadelphia 16,000 bushels.

Export Clearances

During the week ending October 11, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,296,065 bushels. This compared with 1,300,394 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to October 11, 1940 was 16,799,751 bushels compared with 25,310,721 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 11, 1940 amounted to 13,222,481 bushels, a decrease of 11,525,371 bushels from the revised figure of the previous week when 24,747,852 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 22,638,321 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 11, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,379,262 (786,183); Saskatchewan 7,513,885 (13,525,654); Alberta 4,329,334 (8,326,484) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the ten weeks from August 1, 1940 to October 11, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 27,045,173 (45,549,315); Saskatchewan 99,640,662 (158,179,687); Alberta 41,549,255 (69,907,461) bushels. For the ten weeks ending October 11, 1940 and the same period 1939, 168,235,090 and 273,636,463 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending October 12, 1940 amounted to 5,187,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 3,944,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,350,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 70,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 1,197,000 bushels.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 50,888,000 bushels as compared with 101,594,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 28,575,000 bushels as compared with 41,904,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 20,497,000 bushels for the first ten weeks of the present crop year as compared with 34,424,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first ten weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.1 million bushels as compared with 9.2 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 2.9 million bushels as compared with 3.8 million bushels in the same period last year.

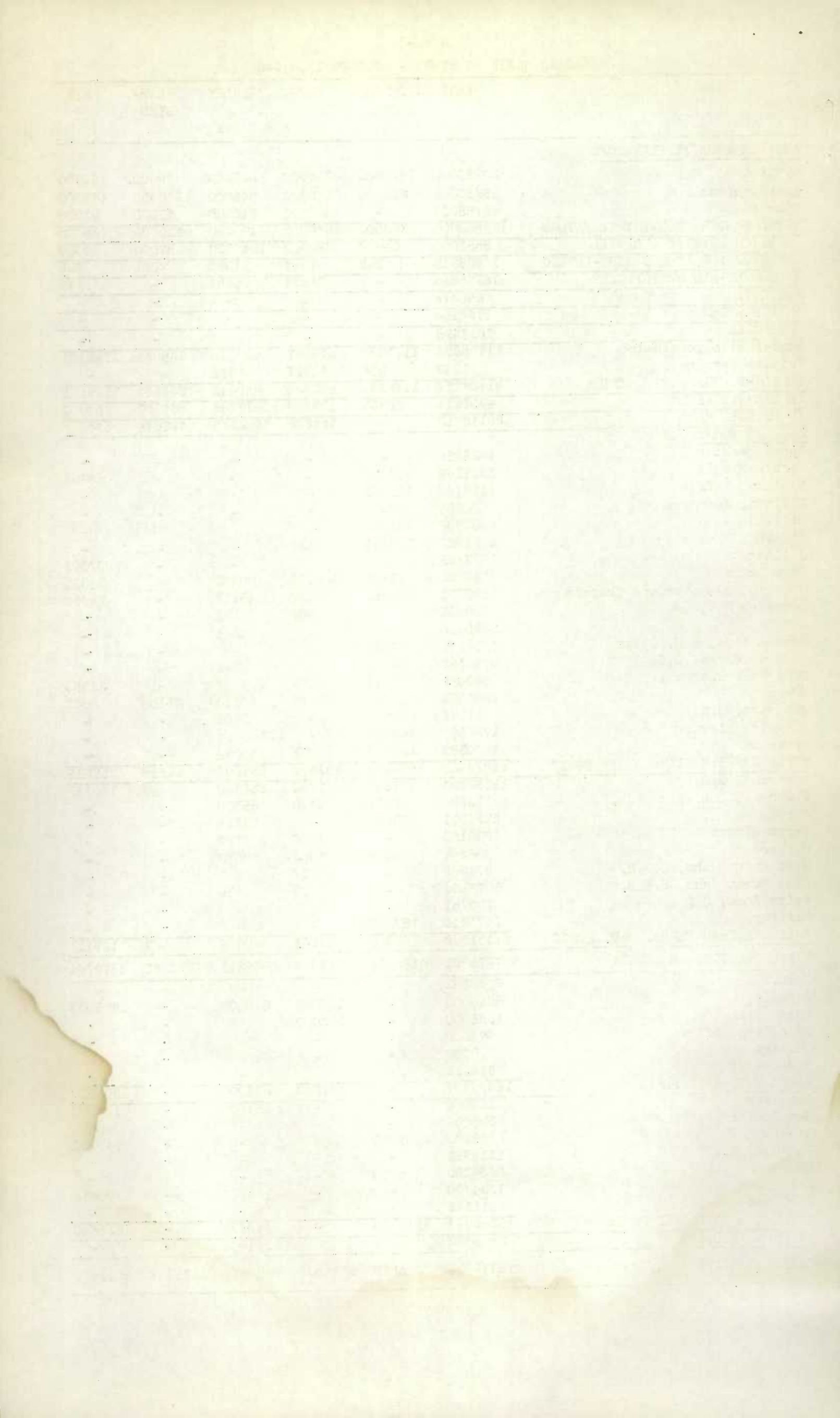
