## WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 18, 1940 increased 11,180,891 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 96,213,625 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 432,779,509 bushels compared with 421,598,618 bushels for the previous week and 336,565,884 bushels for the week of October 20, 1939. The stocks of 432,779,509 bushels include 9,414,586 bushels of Durum wheat,

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 18, 1940 were 394,193,973 bushels compared with 383,732,546 bushels for the previous week and 321,381,884 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators of 171,675,000; Interior Terminals 23,316,346; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,176,607; Victoria 667,513; Prince Rupert 1,135,164; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 82,796,952; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,290,414 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,567,090 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 9,820,000; Victoria 7,141 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 323,278 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 231,615; Vancouver-New Westminster 22,037; Fort William and Port Arthur 102,339 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 365,819 bushels.

For the week ending October 18, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,766,225 bushels and in transit by rail 27,185,266 compared with 3,638,358 in transit on the lakes and 40,252,515 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 38,585,536 bushels, an increase of 719,464 bushels over the previous week when 37,866,072 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 7,346,563; Buffalo 7,186,000; Erie 2,016,000; Erie Canal 383,000; Chicago 26,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,365,000; New York Afloat 555,000; Albany 8,948,000; Fhiladelphia 1,118,952; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,244,020 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,569,542 bushels.

Increases were shown at Duluth of 340,281; Buffale 346,000; Erie 60,000; New York 105,000; New York Afloat 156,000; Albany 74,000 and Baltimore 9,314 bushess, while decreases were noted at Erie Canal of 91,000; Chicago 3,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 277,131 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,184,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 3,724,000; Buffalo Afloat 374,000; Erie 1,539,000; Erie Canal 200,000; New York 4,279,000; New York Afloat 115,000; Albany 3,724,000; Baltimore 135,000; Boston 1,078,000 and Philadelphia 16,000 bushels.

#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 18, 1940 increased 11,180,891 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 96,213,625 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 432,779,509 bushels compared with 421,598,618 bushels for the previous week and 336,565,884 bushels for the week of October 20, 1939. The stocks of 432,779,509 bushels include 9,414,586 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 18, 1940 were 394,193,973 bushels compared with 383,732,546 bushels for the previous week and 321,381,884 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators of 171,675,000; Interior Terminals 23,316,346; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,176,607; Victoria 667,513; Prince Rupert 1,135,164; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 82,796,952; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,290,414 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,567,090 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 9,820,000; Victoria 7,141 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 323,278 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 231,615; Vancouver-New Westminster 22,037; Fort William and Port Arthur 102,339 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 365,819 bushels.

For the week ending October 18, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,766,225 bushels and in transit by rail 27,185,266 compared with 3,638,358 in transit on the lakes and 40,252,515 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.


#### EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 18, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,424,769 bushels. This compared with 1,336,664 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to October 18, 1940 was 18,224,699 bushels compared with 26,647,385 bushels a year age.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 18, 1940 amounted to 15,995,288 bushels, an increase of 1,057,825 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 12,937,463 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 17,201,317 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 18, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,136,027 (625,126); Saskatchewan 7,135,259 (9,975,918); Alberta 5,724,002 (6,600,273) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eleven weeks from August 1, 1940 to October 18, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 28,129,152 (46,174,441); Saskatchewan 106,662,600 (168,155,605); Alberta 47,153,608 (76,507,734) bushels. For the eleven weeks ending October 18, 1940 and the same period 1939, 181,945,360 and 290,837,780 bushels were received from the farms.
