#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 22, 1940 increased 4,631,496 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 97,946,383 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 458,139,360 bushels compared with 453,507,864 bushels for the previous week and 360,192,977 bushels for the week of November 24, 1939. The stocks of 458,139,360 bushels include 9,014,652 bushels of Durum wheat,

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The whoat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending November 22, 1940 were 412,780,334 bushels compared with 410,593,234 bushels for the previous week and 335,754,087 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian olevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 211,680,000; Interior Terminals 23,174,747; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,429,661; Victoria 706,913; Prince Rupert 1,165,138; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,350,253; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,642,068 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 19,718,677 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators 6,125,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 454,40% and Victoria 6,093 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 117,370; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,247,611; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 831,751 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 11,249 bushels.

For the week ending November 22, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 5,717,224 bushels and in transit by rail 10,578,257 compared with 8,944,236 in transit on the lakes and 15,914,152 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.



#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE ENITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 45,359,026 bushels, an increase of 2,444,396 bushels over the previous week when 42,914,630 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 8,016,924; Buffalo 7,893,000; Buffalo Afloat 869,000; Erie 1,989,000; Erie Canal 713,000; Chicago 13,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,752,000; New York Afloat 900,000; Albany 9,204,000; Philadelphia 1,093,607; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Ballimore 2,523,844 bushels. In Transit U,S,A, amounted to 4,564,192 bushels.

Increases were shown at Duluth of 34,066; Buffalo 507,000; Buffalo Afleat 187,000; New York 61,000; New York Afloat 111,000; Albany 203,000; Philadelphia 34,655; Baltimoro 657,473 and In Transit U.S.A. 935,202 bushels, while decreases were noted at Erie Canal of 281,000 and Chicago 5,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,438,890 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 303,980; Buffalo 2,488,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,253,000; Eric 1,515,000; Eric Canal 340,000; New York 5,077,000; New York Afloat 17,000; Albany 4,736,000; Baltimore 2,965,000; Bost in 1,935,000 and Philadelphia 1,806,000 bushels.



#### EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 22, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,580,683 bushels. This compared with 3,653,635 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to November 22, 1940 was 29,953,255 bushels compared with 39,069,843 bushels a year ago.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 22, 1940 amounted to 9,419,158 bushels, an increase of 1,899,454 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 7,519,704 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,418,194 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 22, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,042,357 (383,509); Saskatchewan 4,681,521 (4,225,213); Alberta 3,695,280 (4,809,472) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the sixteen weeks from August 1, 1940 to November 22, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 32,300,990 (48,447,181); Saskatchewan 129,548,479 (194,614,925); Alberta 71,391,808 (96,406,863) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 22, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 233,241,277 and 841,468,969 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending November 23, 1940 amounted to 7,137,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,369,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,912,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 494,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 1,082,000 bushels.


Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1 to November 23, 1940 amounted to 80,055,000 bushels as compared with 160,424,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 48,873,000 bushels as compared with 60,664,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentino shipments amounted to 29,150,000 bushels for the period August 1 to November 23, of the present crop year as compared with 57,552,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.0 million bushels as compared with 9.5 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 3.1 million bushels as compared with 3.6 million bushels in the same period last year.
