

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 16, 1940 increased 2,616,966 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 188,988,311 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 284,567,724 bushels compared with 281,950,758 bushels for the previous week and 95,579,413 bushels for the week of August 18, 1939. The stocks of 284,567,724 bushels include 8,711,665 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 16, 1940 were 253,946,438 bushels compared with 253,214,660 bushels for the previous week and 88,997,413 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 55,950,000; Interior Terminals 22,208,204; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,416,652; Victoria 656,913; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 79,487,428; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 39,727,319 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,264,887 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,440,000; Interior Terminals 877,602; Victoria 44,472; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,364,687 and Eastern Elevators Lake ports 1,796,086 bushels, while decreases were shown at Vancouver-New Westminster of 73,657 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 15,120 bushels.

For the week ending August 16, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,993,034 bushels and in transit by rail 11,611,342; compared with 3,698,853 in transit on the lakes and 3,333,063 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 30,621,286 bushels, an increase of 1,885,188 bushels over the previous week when 28,736,098 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 5,380,000; Buffalo Afloat 918,000; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 1,353,000; Chicago 45,000; New York 1,112,000; New York Afloat 452,000; Albany 7,401,000; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Boston 2,321,264; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 3,638,101 bushels.

Increases were shown at Buffalo of 257,000; Buffalo Afloat 838,000; Erie Canal 508,000; New York 285,000; New York Afloat 53,000; Albany 487,000 and Boston 47,902 bushels, while decreases were noted at Erie of 24,000; Philadelphia 46,667 and In Transit U.S.A. 520,047 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,582,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,209,000; Erie 1,029,000; Erie Canal 59,000; New York 529,000; New York Afloat 89,000 and Albany 3,667,000 bushels.



EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending August 16, 1940 the export clearances overseas of wheat from Canada amounted to 1,153,630 bushels. This compared with 2,973,100 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to August 16, 1940 was 2,686,240 bushels compared with 7,104,902 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 16, 1940 amounted to 3,569,196 bushels, an increase of 1,161,471 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 2,407,725 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,693,928 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 16, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,278,557 (3,558,474); Saskatchewan 1,280,223 (1,197,013); Alberta 1,010,416 (938,441) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the two weeks from August 1, 1940 to August 16, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,449,045 (6,177,187); Saskatchewan 2,387,133 (1,881,525); Alberta 2,140,743 (1,345,240) bushels. For the two weeks ending August 16, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 5,976,921 and 9,403,952 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending August 17, 1940 amounted to 6,696,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,789,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,756,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,279,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 676,000 bushels.

During the first three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 18,771,000 bushels as compared with 30,412,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 9,347,000 bushels as compared with 14,608,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 8,784,000 bushels during the first three weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9,456,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first three weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 6.2 million bushels as compared with 10.1 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 3.1 million bushels as compared with 4.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soyn bean stocks were 770,816 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Rye and corn increased 158 and 1,281,433 bushels respectively, while decreases were noted in wheat of 429,910; oats 42,627; barley 13,922 and soya beans 24,307 bushels.


