



WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 20, 1940 increased 5,683,441 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 131,266,774 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 483,888,664 bushels compared with 478,205,223 bushels for the previous week and 352,621,890 bushels for the week of December 22, 1939. The stocks of 483,888,664 bushels include 8,700,866 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 20, 1940 were 429,857,549 bushels compared with 424,710,698 bushels for the previous week and 313,498,455 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 224,935,000; Interior Terminals 24,752,537; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,610,347; Victoria 765,275; Prince Rupert 1,208,254; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 64,841,355; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 56,059,255 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,049,143 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 1,160,000; Interior Terminals 451,123; Vancouver-New Westminster 138,913; Victoria 19,739; Prince Rupert 2,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,864,556; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 11,083,425 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 33,322 bushels.

For the week ending December 20, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 14,018,987 bushels compared with 9,739,086 bushels for the corresponding period in 1939.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 54,031,115 bushels, an increase of 536,590 bushels over the previous week when 53,494,525 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 11,212,227; Buffalo 11,080,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,898,000; Erie 1,989,000; Chicago 13,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 4,001,000; New York Afloat 1,594,000; Albany 8,823,000; Philadelphia 1,458,093; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 4,666,567 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 3,468,769 bushels.

Increases were noted at Duluth of 1,293,551; Buffalo 49,000; New York 198,000 New York Afloat 256,000 and Philadelphia 306,397 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 115,000; Albany 218,000; Baltimore 50,418 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,172,940 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,123,435 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,689,589; Buffalo 3,999,000; Buffalo Afloat 4,055,000; Erie 25,000; New York 8,489,000; Albany 6,783,000; Baltimore 7,714,000; Boston 1,842,000; Philadelphia 2,885,000 and Portland 641,846 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 20, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,291,837 bushels. This compared with 2,443,261 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to December 20, 1940 was 37,251,398 bushels compared with 51,945,817 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 20, 1940 amounted to 9,150,803 bushels, a decrease of 546,800 bushels from the revised figure of the previous week when 9,697,603 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,934,355 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 20, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 1,263,080 (94,412); Saskatchewan 3,767,227 (1,119,484); Alberta 4,120,496 (1,720,459) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty weeks from August 1, 1940 to December 20, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 37,030,921 (49,218,746); Saskatchewan 148,319,657 (202,375,955); Alberta 87,870,765 (109,508,628) bushels. For the twenty weeks ending December 20, 1940 and the same period in 1939 273,221,343 and 361,103,329 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 21, 1940 amounted to 5,075,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,887,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,866,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,010,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 102,000 bushels.


Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1 to December 21, 1940 amounted to 101,063,000 bushels as compared with 202,512,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 62,645,000 bushels as compared with 75,792,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 33,394,000 bushels for the period August 1 to December 21 of the present crop year as compared with 74,104,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. During the past five weeks Russian shipments amounted to 2,672,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939: (million bushels)

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.1 million bushels as compared with 9.5 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 3.1 million bushels as compared with 3.6 million bushels in the same period last year.
