

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 3, 1941 increased 1,480,854 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 145,893,185 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 494,076,473 bushels compared with 492,595,619 bushels for the previous week and 348,183,288 bushels for the week of January 5, 1940. The stocks of 494,076,473 bushels include 8,879,388 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 3, 1941 were 140,293,437 bushels compared with 438,430,026 bushels for the previous week and 309,630,246 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 224,965,000; Interior Terminals 25,258,445; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,761,501; Victoria 790,546; Prince Rupert 1,208,254; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 73,393,120; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 54,786,168 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,272,876 bushels.

Increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 489,708; Vancouver-New Westminster 65,236; Victoria 26,271 and Fort William and Port Arthur 5,191,450 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 55,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 676,053 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 184,034 bushels.

For the week ending January 3, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 16,240,181 bushels compared with 6,871,553 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 53,782,986 bushels, a decrease of 382,567 bushels from the previous week when 54,165,553 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 12,007,750; Buffalo 11,102,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,898,000; Erie 1,989,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 4,017,000; New York Afloat 1,468,000; Albany 8,568,000; Philadelphia 1,570,384; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 4,281,199 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 3,054,194 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 6,000; New York 3,000; New York Afloat 60,000; Albany 254,000; Baltimore 193,401 and In Transit U.S.A. 174,953 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 269,303 and Philadelphia 39,484 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 38,553,042 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 3,960,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,692,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 6,425,000; Albany 7,598,000; Baltimore 7,599,000; Boston 1,924,000; Philadelphia 2,922,000 and Portland 641,846 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 3, 1941, the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,358,396 bushels. This compared with 1,000,940 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to January 3, 1941 was 39,126,910 bushels compared with 55,854,030 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 3, 1941 amounted to 6,718,504 bushels, a decrease of 1,866,929 bushels from the revised figure of the previous week when 8,585,433 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,205,653 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 3, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,046,786 (36,452); Saskatchewan 2,649,806 (761,144); Alberta 3,021 912 (408,057) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-two weeks from August 1, 1940 to January 3, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 39,167,002 (49,353,941); Saskatchewan 155,000,931 (203,941,423); Alberta 93,734,261 (110,645,341) bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending January 3, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 287,902,194 and 363,940,705 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending January 4, 1941 amounted to 3,520,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,127,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,004,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 669,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to January 4, 1941 amounted to 109,355,000 bushels as compared with 219,048,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 67,278,000 bushels as compared with 81,568,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 36,421,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to January 4, 1941, of the present crop year as compared with 80,184,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. During the past seven weeks Russian shipments amounted to 3,432,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.0 million bushels as compared with 9.5 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1939-40. North American weekly average shipments were 3.1 million bushels as compared with 3.6 million bushels in the same period last year.


