WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 31, 1941 decreased 2,288,985 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 157,916,261 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 493,552,592 bushels compared with 495,841,577 bushels for the previous week and 335,636,331 bushels for the week of February 2, 1940. The stocks of 493,552,592 bushels include 8,493,710 bushels of Durum Wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 31, 1941 were 445,152,801 bushels compared with 446,571,224 bushels for the previous week and 301,433,897 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 235,045,000; Interior Terminals 25,504,721; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,793,613; Victoria 952,162; Prince Rupert 1,208,179; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 86,892,048; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 45,808,274 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,660,558 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Interior Terminals of 136,127; Vancouver-New Westminster 24,797; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,571,740 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 467,236 bushels, while increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 1,530,000; Victoria 12,297 and Fort William and Port Arthur 1,511,930 bushels.

For the week ending January 31, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 6,690,850 bushels compared with 13,218,114 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 48,399,791 bushels, a decrease of 870,562 bushels from the previous week when 49,270,353 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 12,721,471; Buffalo 9,542,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,451,000; Erie 1,989,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,672,000; New York Afloat 1,271,000; Albany 8,307,000; Philadelphia 1,016,070; Boston 1,836,569; Portland 1,282,619 and Baltimore 2,031,465 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,895,282 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 399,000; New York 172,000; Philadelphia 42,672; Boston 50,685; Baltimore 179,138 and In Transit U.S.A. 435,539 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 166,017; New York Afloat 128,000 and Portland 114,455 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 34,202,434 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 3,864,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,097,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 3,509,000; Albany 7,598,000; Baltimore 7,447,000; Boston 1,705,000; Philadelphia 2,515,000 and Portland 676,238 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 31, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,417,629 bushels. This compared with 3,744,769 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to January 31, 1941 was 50,661,884 bushels compared with 71,746,224 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 31, 1941 amounted to 3,273,606 bushels, a decrease of 2,166,883 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 5,440,489 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 900,085 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 31, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 309,613 (41,854); Saskatchewan 1,565,810 (381,577); Alberta 1,398,183 (476,654) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-six weeks from August 1, 1940 to January 31, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 40,942,551 (49,555,137); Saskatchewan 162,571,024 (205,566,047); Alberta 101,964,784 (112,590,243) bushels. For the twenty-six weeks ending January 31, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 305,478,359 and 367,723,766 bushels were received from the farms.


World shipments for the week ending February 1, 1941 amounted to 4,744,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,405,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,868,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 493,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 234,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to February 1, 1941 amounted to 124,899,000 bushels as compared with 256,584,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 79,990,000 bushels as compared with 98,480,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 39,725,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to February 1, 1941 of the present crop year as compared with 93,048,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.


