WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 7, 1941 decreased 1,481,391 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 159,866,594 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 492,071,201 bushels compared with 493,552,592 bushels for the previous week and 332,204,607 bushels for the week of February 9, 1940. The stocks of 492,071,201 bushels include 8,507,692 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 7, 1941 were 444,127,957 bushels compared with 445,152,801 bushels for the previous week and 299,823,179 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 237,240,000; Interior Terminals 25,534,101; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,959,436; Victoria 947,861; Prince Rupert 1,208,179; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 87,833,942; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 43,687,064 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,576,573 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 2,121,210 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 2,083,985 bushels, while increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,195,000; Interior Terminals 29,380; Vancouver-New Westminster 165,823; Victoria 15,699 and Fort William and Port Arthur 941,894 bushels.

For the week ending February 7, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 6,523,405 bushels compared with 11,288,156 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 47,943,244 bushels, a decrease of 456,547 bushels from the previous week when 48,399,791 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 13,104,870; Buffalo 9,426,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,153,000; Erie 1,989,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,479,000; New York Afloat 1,130,000; Albany 8,307,000; Philadelphia 1,149,075; Boston 2,345,334; Portland 1,104,722 and Baltimore 1,967,879 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,403,049 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 116,000; Buffalo Afloat 298,000; New York 193,000; New York Afloat 141,000; Portland 177,897; Baltimore 63,586 and In Transit U.S.A. 492,233 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 383,399; Philadelphia 133,005 and Boston 508,765 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,381,428 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Buffalo 3,663,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,923,000; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 1,034,319; New York 2,692,000; Albany 7,598,000; Baltimore 7,143,000; Boston 1,782,000; Philadelphia 2,084,000 and Portland 705,232 bushels.


EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 7, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,397,707 bushels. This compared with 2,463,909 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to February 7, 1941 was 55,059,591 bushels compared with 74,215,133 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 7, 1941 amounted to 4,601,809 bushels, an increase of 1,459,205 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 3,142,604 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,190,500 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 7, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 558,007 (50,502); Saskatchewan 2,088,714 (537,742); Alberta 1,955,088 (614,595) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-seven weeks from August 1, 1940 to February 7, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 41,529,367 (49,605,639); Saskatchewan 164,570,425 (206,103,789); Alberta 103,849,374 (113,204,838) bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 7, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 309,949,166 and 368,914,266 bushels were received from the farms.


World shipments for the week ending February 8, 1941 amounted to 3,929,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,744,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,186,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 462,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 385,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to February 8, 1941 amounted to 128,606,000 bushels as compared with 265,770,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 83,106,000 bushels as compared with 102,712,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 40,420,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to February 8, 1941 of the present crop year as compared with 94,984,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.


