WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 7, 1941 decreased 3,276,975 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 167,840,542 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 485,401,719 bushels compared with 488,678,694 bushels for the previous week and 317,561,177 bushels for the week of March 8, 1940. The stocks of 485,401,719 bushels include 7,980,537 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 7, 1941 were 439,285,651 bushels compared with 442,407,774 bushels for the previous week and 291,178,708 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 244,685,000; Interior Terminals 26,090,025; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,173,082; Victoria 903,278; Prince Rupert 1,208,179; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 89,579,011; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 30,468,592 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 19,812,381 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 3,896,182 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 842,073 bushels, while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 910,000; Interior Terminals 135,931; Vancouver-New Westminster 142,363; Victoria 3,579 and Fort William and Port Arthur 241,390 bushels.

For the week ending March 7, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 5,748,707 bushels compared with 7,192,462 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 46,116,068 bushels, a decrease of 154,852 bushels from the previous week when 46,270,920 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 15,366,338; Erie 1,634,000; Buffalo 9,272,000; Buffalo Afloat 448,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 2,710,000; New York Afloat 389,000; Boston 1,618,822; Portland 1,049,234; Philadelphia 726,432; Baltimore 1,406,533 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,804,394 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Erie of 355,000; Buffalo 18,000; New York 357,000; New York Afloat 78,000; Boston 180,556 and Portland 156,952 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 601,105; Philadelphia 47,347 and In Transit U.S.A. 342,204 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,382,469 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 422,000; Erie Afloat 637,347; Buffalo 2,511,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,389,000; Albany 7,598,000; New York 932,000; Boston 1,499,000; Portland 548,245; Philadelphia 2,009,000 and Baltimore 6,105,000 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 7, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,687,587 bushels. This compared with 4,174,655 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to March 7, 1941 was 69,836,383 bushels compared with 88,455,969 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 7, 1941 amounted to 2,972,075 bushels, an increase of 197,772 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 2,774,303 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,606,413 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 7, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 290,877 (101,411); Saskatchewan 1,264,571 (820,215); Alberta 1,416,627 (726,787) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-one weeks from August 1, 1940 to March 7, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 42,622,054 (49,980,200); Saskatchewan 171,612,953 (208,964,140); Alberta 111,678,460 (115,848,426) bushels. For the thirty-one weeks ending March 7, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 325,913,467 and 374,792,766 bushels were received from the farms.


World shipments for the week ending March 8, 1941 amounted to 6,682,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,197,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,928,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,758,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 727,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to March 8, 1941 amounted to 149,865,000 bushels as compared with 306,418,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 99,145,000 bushels as compared with 123,096,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 45,720,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to March 8, 1941 of the present crop year as compared with 105,456,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.






