WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 21, 1941 decreased 2,857,865 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 170,349,252 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 483,557,260 bushels compared with 486,415,125 bushels for the previous week and 313,208,008 bushels for the week of March 22, 1940. The stocks of 483,557,260 bushels include 7,623,764 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 21, 1941 were 439,014,909 bushels compared with 440,676,933 bushels for the previous week and 288,445,718 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 244,430,000; Interior Terminals 26,181,325; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,424,183; Victoria 946,967; Prince Rupert 1,208,162; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 90,632,080; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 22,161,779 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 19,399,101 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 4,052,836 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 55,281 bushels, while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 30,000; Interior Terminals 128,207; Vancouver-New Westminster 125,804; Victoria 22,327 and Fort William and Port Arthur 599,366 bushels.

For the week ending March 21, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 13,013,916 bushels compared with 6,974,093 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.

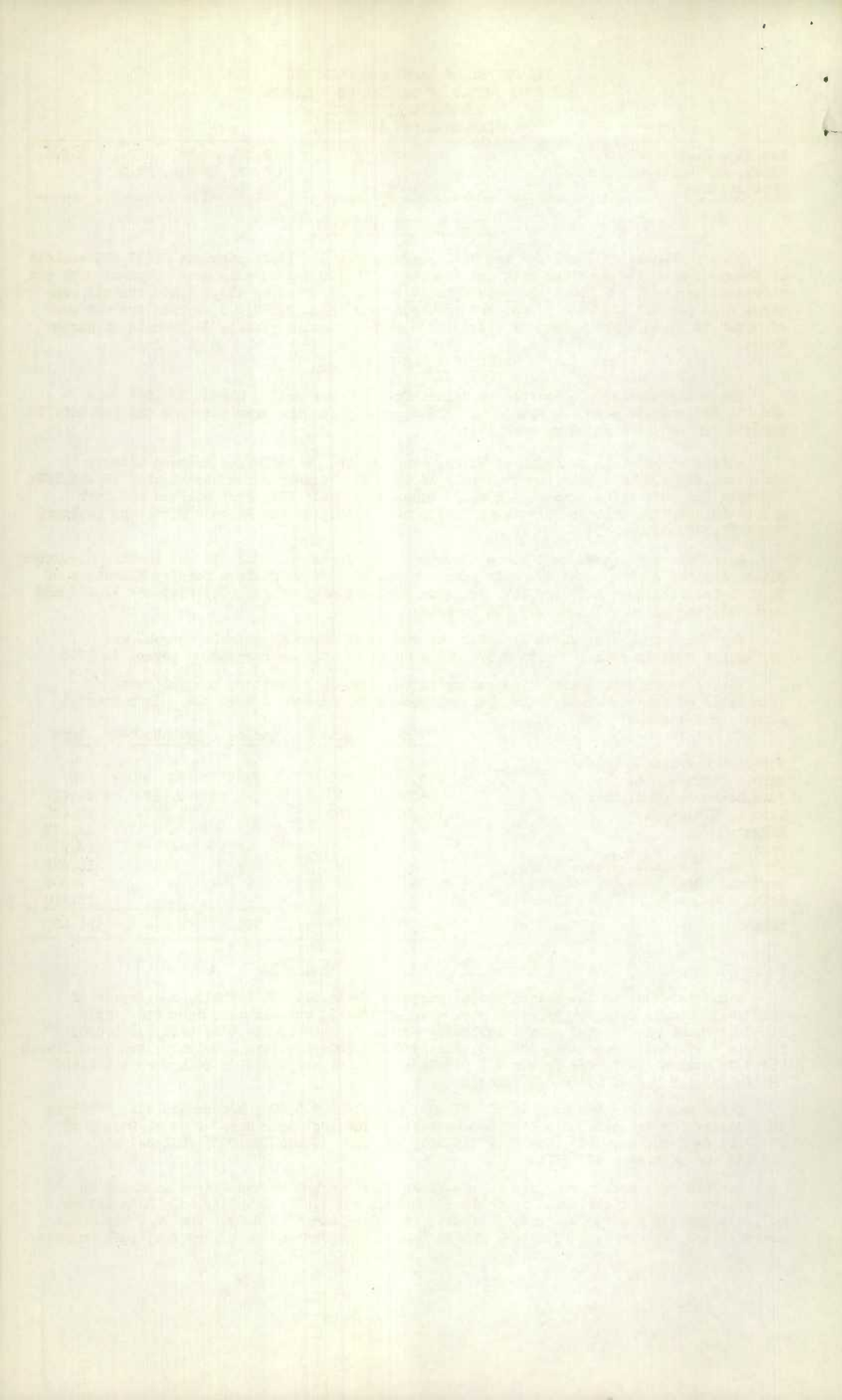

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 44,542,351 bushels, a decrease of 1,195,841 bushels from the previous week when 45,738,192 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 15,787,323; Erie 1,178,000; Buffalo 6,972,000; Ogdensburg 425,000; Albany 8,307,000; New York 2,880,000; New York Afloat 715,000; Boston 1,443,738; Portland 1,065,653; Philadelphia 852,901; Baltimore 1,499,288 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,416,448 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Erie of 367,000; Buffalo 1,008,000; Boston 216,779; Portland 141,041; and In Transit U.S.A. 626,343 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 134,752; Ogdensburg 40,685; New York 216,000; New York Afloat 460,000; Philadelphia 219,130 and Baltimore 92,755 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,762,290 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,751,877; Erie 128,000; Erie Afloat 637,347; Buffalo 2,569,000; Buffalo Afloat 877,000; Albany 7,598,000; New York 716,000; Boston 1,153,906; Portland 952,796; Philadelphia 1,986,996 and Baltimore 5,411,368 bushels.



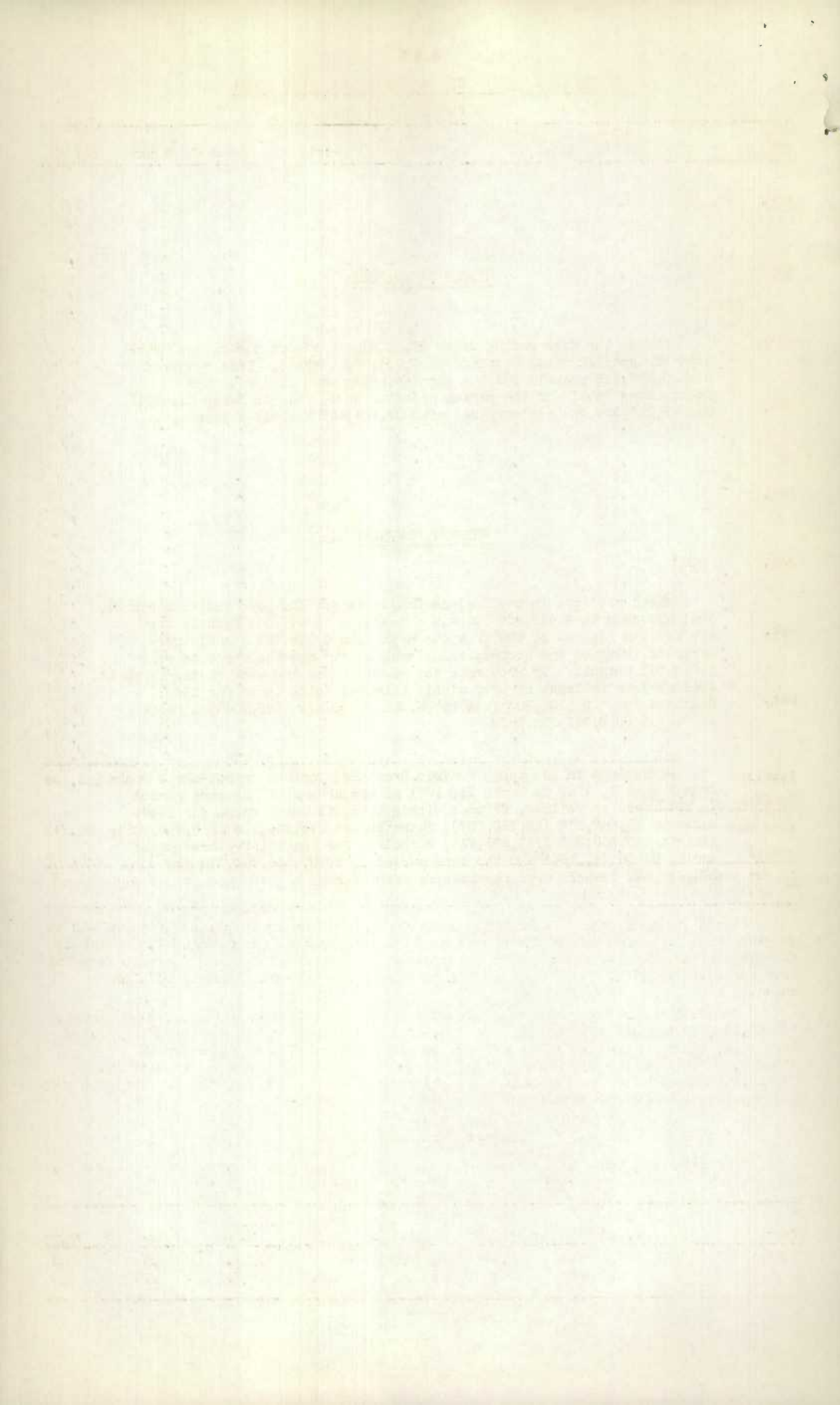
EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 21, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,784,041 bushels. This compared with 3,282,345 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to March 21, 1941 was 78,259,329 bushels compared with 97,164,438 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 21, 1941 amounted to 4,478,855 bushels a decrease of 446,341 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 4,925,196 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,868,552 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 21, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 568,896 (203,803); Saskatchewan 2,105,224 (976,704); Alberta 1,804,735 (688,045) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-three weeks from August 1, 1940 to March 21, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 43,847,118 (50,325,807); Saskatchewan 175,834,134 (210,993,902); Alberta 115,300,388 (117,293,738) bushels. For the thirty-three weeks ending March 21, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 334,981,640 and 378,613,447 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending March 22, 1941 amounted to 5,641,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,757,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,713,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,709,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 407,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to March 22, 1941 amounted to 163,136,000 bushels as compared with 329,283,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 108,824,000 bushels as compared with 135,256,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 49,424,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to March 22, 1941 of the present crop year as compared with 109,976,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.
