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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 28, 1941 decreased 543,256 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 172,293,132 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 483,014,004 bushels compared with 483,557,260 bushels for the previous week and 310,720,872 bushels for the week of March 29, 1940. The stocks of 483,014,004 bushels include 7,518,571 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 28, 1941 were 438,973,293 bushels compared with 439,014,909 bushels for the previous week and 288,391,777 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 244,835,000; Interior Terminals 25,987,924; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,423,442; Victoria 975,450; Prince Rupert 1,208,145; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 91,106,631; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 18,520,167 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,155,856 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 193,401; Vancouver-New Westminster 741; Prince Rupert 17 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 3,641,612 bushels, while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 405,000; Victoria 28,483; Fort William and Port Arthur 474,551 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 756,755 bushels.

For the week ending March 28, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 15,143,282 bushels compared with 6,781,241 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 44,040,711 bushels, a decrease of 501,640 bushels from the previous week when 44,542,351 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 15,913,936; Erie 959,000; Buffalo 6,462,000; Ogdensburg 360,000; Albany 8,307,000; New York 2,796,000; New York Afloat 617,000; Boston 1,381,232; Portland 1,487,512; Philadelphia 802,679; Baltimore 2,203,945 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,750,407 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Erie of 219,000; Buffalo 510,000; Ogdensburg 65,000; New York 84,000; New York Afloat 98,000; Boston 62,506; Philadelphia 50,222 and In Transit U.S.A. 666,041 bushels, while increases were shown at Duluth of 126,613; Portland 421,859 and Baltimore 704,657 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,329,095 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 25,000; Erie Afloat 637,347; Buffalo 2,368,000; Buffalo Afloat 283,000; Albany 7,598,000; New York 436,000; Boston 1,099,177; Portland 952,796; Philadelphia 1,731,166 and Baltimore 4,466,732 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 28, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,566,987 bushels. This compared with 3,161,034 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to March 28, 1941 was 61,826,316 bushels compared with 100,325,472 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 28, 1941 amounted to 4,392,569 bushels a decrease of 133,411 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 4,525,980 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,934,189 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 28, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 524,843 (147,352); Saskatchewan 1,881,312 (1,022,349); Alberta 1,986,414 (758,512) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-four weeks from August 1, 1940 to March 28, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 44,380,554 (50,473,159); Saskatchewan 177,729,781 (212,016,251); Alberta 117,310,999 (118,052,250) bushels. For the thirty-four weeks ending March 28, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 339,421,334 and 380,547,636 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending March 29, 1941 amounted to 6,916,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,641,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,113,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,308,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 33,000 bushels.

Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to March 29, 1941 amounted to 170,052,000 bushels as compared with 339,396,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 114,120,000 bushels as compared with 140,656,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40. Argentine shipments amounted to 51,044,000 bushels for the period August 1, 1940 to March 29, 1941 of the present crop year as compared with 111,840,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.
